

4.0 Landscape Character Zones

5 LIBRARY TERRACE AND PODIUM PLANTING

The library terrace provides opportunity for informal seating and gathering to an eastern terrace, surrounded by podium plantings of native grasses and *Macrozamia* sp.

6 ENTRANCE FORECOURT

A landscaped entrance forecourt provides a breathing space for the school entrance along the narrow footpath of Chalmers Street, and provides opportunity for engagement and address with the street. Sculptural sky lights provide the opportunity for light to penetrate through to the Performing Arts Learning Community below.

7 COMMUNITY HUB

The level one terrace, with cafe seating, covered outdoor recreation zones and the cafe kitchen, connects directly to the library and Student Community Hub. Embracing two connected levels, this is the heart of the campus and is the focal point for students with views out to the park and across to the Amphitheatre. This is the one stop shop for the students, staff and parents: a vibrant active visible and inclusive space.

8 BASKETBALL TERRACE

Level 5 provides a full sized netball/basketball court with adjacent active play space to an undercroft area. The games deck has tiered seating, a BBQ area and sink. With direct access to the Food Tech facilities, vegetable

9 PODIUM PLANTING

Podium planting generally consists hardy drought tolerant species, suitable for city roof garden planting.

10 ROOF GARDEN

Level 12 demonstrates principles of agriculture, permaculture and climate study with facilities such as a meteorology station, bee hives and bee gardens, and out door science learning areas.
