PRELIMINARY ABORIGINAL HERITAGE ASSESSMENT REPORT – BURWOOD

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Executive Summary

Heritage Now Pty Ltd was engaged by NSW Housing Corporation Pty Ltd to prepare a Preliminary Aboriginal Heritage Assessment report for a State Significant Development addressing proposed mixed-use development works at 2-4 Burleigh Street and 20-24 Railway Parade, Burwood. This assessment included a review and analysis of background information, and a site inspection undertaken by Tiffany Jones (Heritage Now) and Justine Coplin (Darug Custodian Aboriginal Corporation).

The inspection confirmed that the Project Area has been subject to ground disturbance, and no Aboriginal sites, objects or Potential Archaeological Deposits (PADs) were identified. Based on previous Cumberland Plain investigations which have identified only low average artefact density and sparse artefact distributions in the vicinity of 1st order streams, the geotechnical investigation revealing relatively shallow topsoil, and the degree of disturbance caused by construction and demolition of buildings, asphalt and other services (on a slope landform which would have been modified to provide a level surface for these buildings), subsurface archaeological potential in the Project Area is assessed to be low.

Heritage Now makes the following recommendations:

Recommendation 1

All on-site personnel are to be made aware of their obligations under the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974*. This includes the protection of Aboriginal sites and the reporting of any new or suspected Aboriginal heritage sites. This may be done through an on-site Aboriginal cultural heritage induction or other suitable format.

Recommendation 2

In the unlikely event that Aboriginal, or suspected Aboriginal, archaeological material is uncovered during the development, then works in that area are to stop and the area is to be cordoned off. The project manager is to contact the heritage consultant to make an assessment as to whether the material is classed as Aboriginal object/s under the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974*, and advise on the required management and mitigation measures. Works are not to recommence in the cordoned off area until heritage clearance has been given and/or the required management and mitigation measures have been implemented.

Recommendation 3

In the unlikely event that human remains, or suspected human remains, are uncovered during the development, works in that area are to stop and the area is to be cordoned off. The project manager is to contact the NSW Police to establish whether the area is a crime scene. If it is not a crime scene, and the remains are determined to be Aboriginal ancestral remains, Heritage NSW is to be notified via the Environment Line on 131 555 and management measures are to be devised in consultation with the local Aboriginal community. Works are not to recommence in the area until the management measures have been implemented.

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1 Introduction

Heritage Now Pty Ltd (Heritage Now) was engaged by NSW Housing Corporation Pty Ltd to prepare a Preliminary Aboriginal Heritage Assessment report for a State Significant Development (SSD) addressing proposed mixed-use development works at Burwood.

The aim of the Preliminary Aboriginal Heritage Assessment report is to assess the likelihood of Aboriginal objects being harmed by the proposed activity, whether further investigation is warranted and whether the activity requires an Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permit (AHIP) application (DECCW 2010:2).

1.1 Project Area

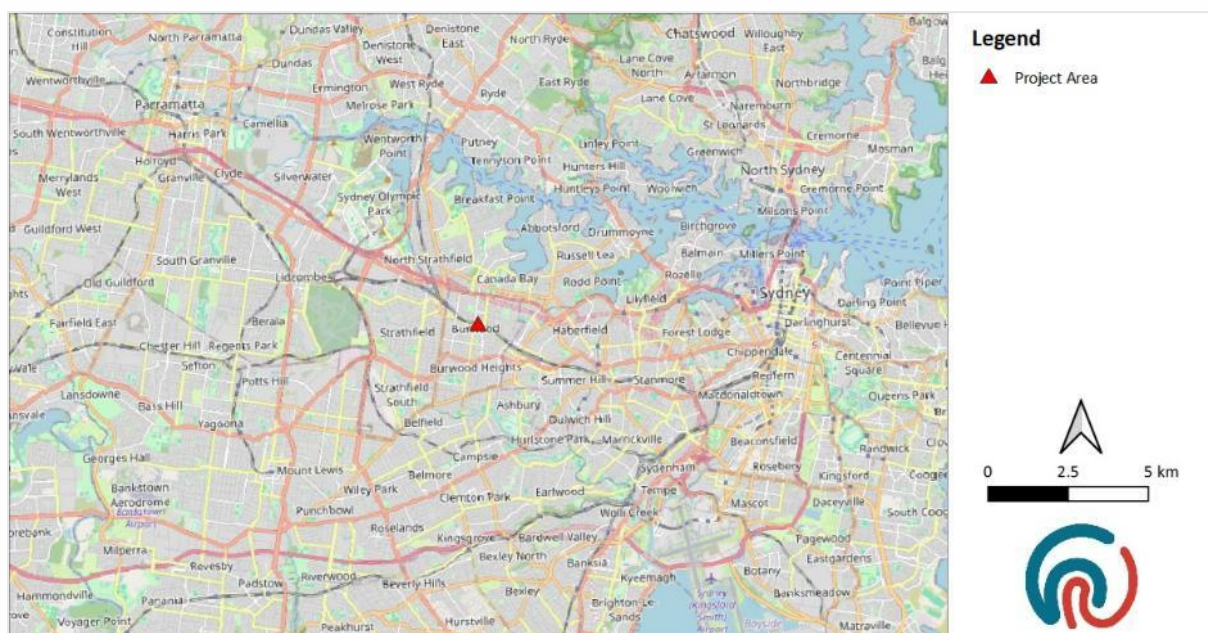


Figure 1. The Project Area in a regional context. (Source: SCP with Heritage Now additions)

The Project Area is located at 2-4 Burleigh Street and 20-24 Railway Parade, Burwood, in the Burwood Local Government Area (LGA) (Figure 1). It comprises Lots A-E DP438222, Parish of Concord, County of Cumberland and lies within the boundaries of Metropolitan Local Aboriginal Land Council.

The Project Area is bounded by Railway Parade in the north, residential buildings in the east and south, and Burleigh Street in the west (Figure 2).

1.2 Legislative Context

This section provides an outline of the legislative and environmental planning context under which this assessment was undertaken at the time of reporting. It is for information purposes only and should not be taken as legal advice.

1.2.1 National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974 (NSW)

The *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974* (NPW Act) contains provisions for protecting Aboriginal objects and declared Aboriginal places in NSW. An Aboriginal object is defined as:

...any deposit, object or material evidence (not being a handicraft made for sale) relating to the Aboriginal habitation of the area that comprises New South Wales, being habitation before or concurrent with (or both) the occupation of that area by persons of non-Aboriginal extraction, and includes Aboriginal remains.

An Aboriginal place is an area of land that “is or was of special significance with respect to Aboriginal culture”, and is recognised by a declaration published in the Government Gazette by the Minister for Environment and Heritage.

Under Section 86 of the NPW Act, it is an offence to harm (destroy, deface or damage) or desecrate an Aboriginal object or an Aboriginal Place. The definition of harm includes moving an object from the land on which it is situated. The NPW Act sets out tiered strict liability offences and penalties for harming or desecrating Aboriginal objects or places.

Under Section 87, there are certain defences to the offence of harm. These include that harm was carried out under an Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permit (AHIP); that due diligence was exercised to determine if an action would harm an Aboriginal object; or that the activity was prescribed as a low impact act in the National Parks and Wildlife Regulation 2019.

The Aboriginal Heritage Information Management System (AHIMS) holds information about Aboriginal sites (Aboriginal objects and declared Aboriginal Places) in NSW. Under Section 89A, the

location of an Aboriginal object must be reported to Heritage NSW within a reasonable time, unless it has previously been identified and a record submitted to AHIMS.

National Parks and Wildlife Regulation 2019

The National Parks and Wildlife Regulation 2019 (NPW Regulation) provides a framework for exercising due diligence and identifies codes of practice to determine whether an activity is likely to cause harm to Aboriginal objects (Section 57), as well as specifically defines certain low impact activities (Section 58). Compliance with the *Due Diligence Code of Practice for the Protection of Aboriginal Objects in NSW* (DECCW 2010) or other industry specific code adopted under the NPW Regulation constitutes a defence against prosecution if an Aboriginal object is unknowingly harmed without an Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permit.

The NPW Regulation also outlines requirements for Aboriginal consultation (Section 60) and matters to be dealt with in an Aboriginal cultural heritage assessment report (Section 61), to be submitted with an Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permit application.

1.2.2 Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 (NSW)

The *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* (EP&A Act) provides triggers for undertaking environmental and heritage assessments as part of the wider land-use planning framework. Part 4 details how authorities are to determine development applications, as well as identifying whether projects require an Environmental Impact Statement. Part 9 outlines the implementation and enforcement of the EP&A Act.

The EP&A Act also allows for the making of environmental planning instruments: State environmental planning policies (SEPPs) that deal with matters of state or regional planning significance, and local environmental plans (LEPs) for the purpose of planning within a local government area.

Burwood Local Environmental Plan 2012

The Burwood Local Environmental Plan 2012 (LEP) requires development consent to demolish, disturb, excavate or develop land on which an Aboriginal object is located or that is within an Aboriginal place of significance. The consent authority must consider the effect of a proposal on an Aboriginal place of significance and any Aboriginal object located within an area of works. Council must inform the local Aboriginal community about the application where impacts to Aboriginal cultural heritage may occur. Heritage items are listed on the LEP in Schedule 5, and can include a building, work, place, relic, tree, object or archaeological site.

There are no Aboriginal objects or places of significance within the Project Area listed on Schedule 5 of the LEP.

1.3 Methodology

This Preliminary Aboriginal Heritage Assessment report was prepared in accordance with the due diligence process outlined in the *Due Diligence Code of Practice for the Protection of Aboriginal Objects in NSW* (DECCW 2010:10).

1.4 Authorship and Acknowledgements

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2 Environmental and Heritage Context

The analysis of environmental and heritage information is required under the Due Diligence Code of Practice (DECCW 2010:11–12) as part of assessing if Aboriginal object/s are at risk of harm.

2.1 Environmental Context

This section provides the environmental context for the assessment of past Aboriginal occupation in the Project Area, focusing on whether there are any landscape features likely to indicate the presence of Aboriginal objects. Particular landscape features identified in the Due Diligence Code of Practice include areas of undisturbed land:

- within 200m of waters, or
- located within a sand dune system, or
- located on a ridge top, ridge line or headland, or
- located within 200m below or above a cliff face, or
- within 20m of or in a cave, rock shelter, or a cave mouth (DECCW 2010:12).

2.1.1 Topography, Geology and Soils

The Project Area is located in the Cumberland lowlands physiographic region, which lies within the centre area of the Sydney Basin on Wianamatta Group geology, with topography that comprises plains and gently undulating low hills (Chapman and Murphy 2020:2). It is also located within the Cumberland subregion of the Sydney Basin bioregion, which is characterised by wide valleys and low rolling hills in the area of the Blue Mountains rain shadow. On shale geology, low hills have been formed by volcanics. On volcanics, soils typically consist of red to brown pedal uniform clays, and on slopes, texture contrast soils of red and yellow are expected (NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service 2003:193). The Project Area is located on a midslope landform, at an elevation of 26m. Geological mapping indicates that the Project Area is located on Ashfield Shale of the Wianamatta Group, consisting of black to dark-grey shale and laminite (Herbert 1983).

The Project Area is located within the residual Blacktown soil landscape (Figure 3). On upper slopes and midslope landforms, dominant soil materials are expected to consist of up to 30cm of friable brownish-black loam (A₁ Horizon), overlying 10-20cm of hardsetting brown clay loam (A₂ Horizon), overlying 20-50cm of strongly pedal, mottled brown light clay (B Horizon) (Chapman and Murphy 1989:24–25). Therefore, depending on past land use and levels of disturbance, up to 50cm of topsoil may be expected across the Project Area; although geotechnical investigation suggests that this topsoil has likely been truncated and covered in fill and asphalt (see Section 2.1.4).

2.1.2 Hydrology

Access to fresh water is known as a primary consideration for Aboriginal people when selecting camp site locations. The sensitivity of waterways for Aboriginal campsites is also reflected in the *Due Diligence Code of Practice*, which considers areas within 200m of waters archaeologically sensitive (DECCW 2010:12).

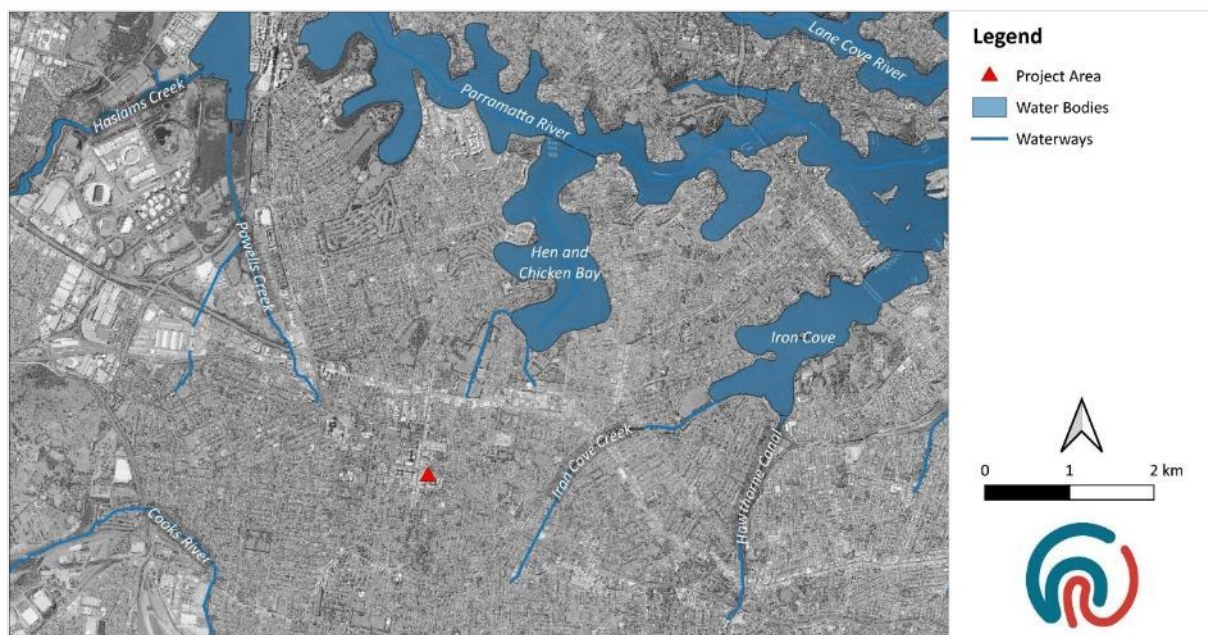


Figure 4. Hydrology of the Project Area. (Source: Hydrology data © SCP 2020 SCP with Heritage Now additions)

The Project Area is located in the Sydney Harbour and Parramatta River catchments. Currently, there are no sources of fresh water close by, the nearest being Iron Cove Creek, which is approximately 1.48km east of the Project Area. The estuarine Hen and Chicken Bay is approximately 1.97km north-east of the Project Area (Figure 4).

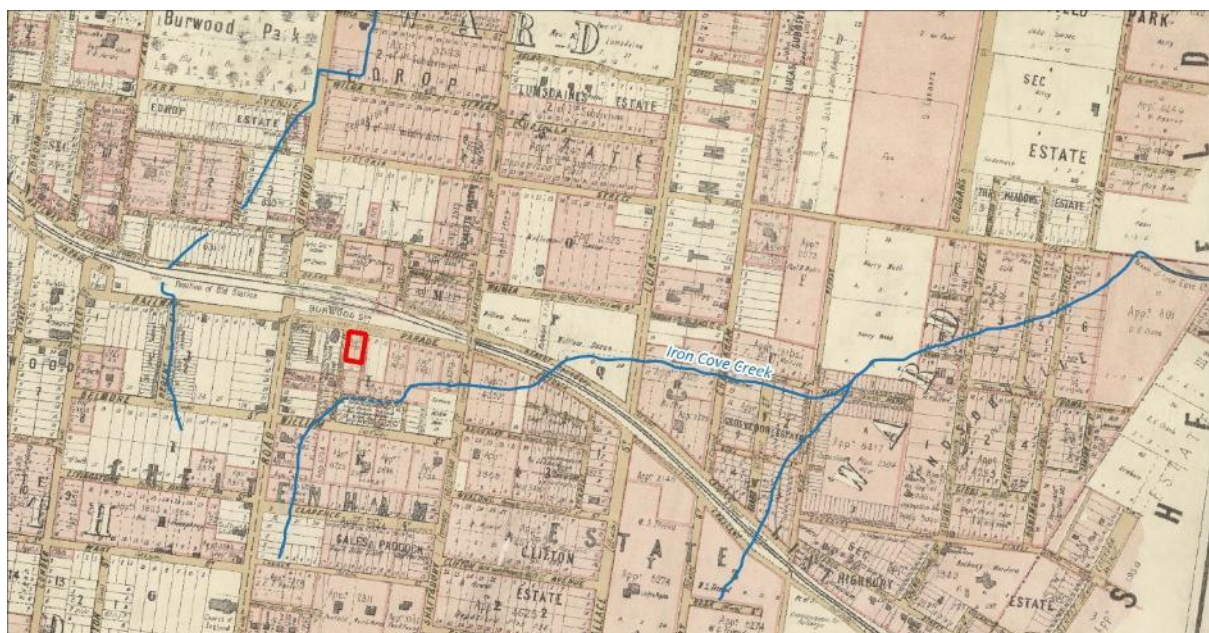


Figure 5. 1893 map of the municipality of Burwood, showing some of the streams passing through Burwood and the Project Area in red. (Source: State Library of NSW, Z/M4 811.1836/1893/1)

A historical 1893 map of the municipality of Burwood shows some streamlines passing through the suburb (Figure 5), including a first order branch of Iron Cove Creek extending through Elizabeth Street and continuing southward almost to Church Street (approximately 70m south of the Project Area); and another unnamed first order stream, likely flowing north into Hen and Chicken Bay (located approximately 290m west of the Project Area). However, it is likely that the paths of these streams were not mapped in their natural alignment and have been altered with pipes and culverts.

2.1.3 Vegetation

This section is intended to give a general overview of the flora and fauna that may have been used by Aboriginal people in the past. The information is supplied for understanding the past Aboriginal use of the landscape and is not intended for ecological assessment purposes.

While the Project Area is now cleared of vegetation, past Aboriginal people may have encountered vegetation similar to Northern Hinterland Wet Sclerophyll Forests in the Project Area. This vegetation class consists of up to 40m tall dry eucalypt forests where a diverse plant species can be found (*Northern Hinterland Wet Sclerophyll Forests* n.d.). The canopy comprises predominantly of

tallowwood, blackbutt, grey gum, grey ironbark, and turpentine, with forest oak present as small trees. Smaller shrubs may include species such as coffee bush, dogwood, lance beard-heath, narrow-leaved orange bark, narrow-leaved geebung, and elderberry panax. Common scramblers can include giant water vine, trailing guinea flower, climbing guinea flower, wonga wonga vine and sarsaparilla. Forbs species may comprise of broome spurge, slender tick-trefoil, blue flax lily, rainforest crane's-bill, iron weed, and bracken.

Many of the plant species of the forest may have been used by Aboriginal people. The timbers of eucalypts could be used to create tools, vessels and canoes (Nash 2004:7–8). The fruits of plants such as the geebung and coffee bush produce edible fruits (Brayshaw 1987). The seeds, juice and flesh of unripe geebung fruit were used for treating burns, scratches and rashes. Ripe fruit on the ground also attracted possums, bandicoots and wallabies (Caton and Hardwick 2018:337). The fruit of the blue flax lily are also edible and its leaves were used to create cords (Nash 2004:5).

2.1.4 Past Land-Use

Land is considered disturbed if it has been the subject of human activity that has changed the land's surface, being changes that remain clear and observable. Examples include ploughing, construction of rural infrastructure, roads, trails and tracks, vegetation clearance, construction of buildings, structures and utilities and other impacts involving earthworks (DECCW 2010:18).

A 19th century map of the Parish of Concord shows that the Project Area was part of Alexander Riley's 1000-acre estate (Figure 6). During Riley's ownership, Burwood Villa was constructed, and it was noted by Joseph Lycett that five hundred acres of land was cleared, with 4 acres of this dedicated to a garden where:

"upwards of three hundred Trees, bearing the following choice fruits, -viz. the Orange, Citron, Lemon, Pomegranate, Loquat, Guava, Grapes, Peaches, Nectarines, Apricots, Apples, Pears, the Cherry, Plums, Figs, Chestnuts, Almonds, Medlars, Quinces: with the abundance of Raspberries, Strawberries, and the finest of Melons" (Joseph Lycett 1824).

The exact location of the land clearance and the fruit tree plantings is unknown, however, due to the proximity of the Project Area to the Burwood Villa, which excavations have confirmed to have originally stood on the western side of Park Road (Archaeological Management & Consulting Group Pty Ltd 2003), it is likely the Project Area was part of the 500 acres of cleared land.

A municipality of Burwood map from 1893 shows that the Project Area had been subdivided, but no buildings had yet been constructed (Figure 5). However, an aerial image from 1944 shows that almost the entirety of the Project Area is covered by residential buildings (three adjoining houses along Railway Parade and two adjoining houses on Burleigh Street) and concrete (Figure 7). Gardens are visible behind the properties on Burleigh Street. An additional structure is visible on the eastern boundary of the Project Area in a 1975 aerial image, behind the residence at 20 Railway Parade (Figure 8). The 1994 aerial image shows that an addition has been constructed on the back of the residence of 4 Burleigh Street and concrete has been laid behind the Burleigh Street properties (Figure 9). An awning can also be seen behind the residence of 22 Railway Parade. A 2014 aerial image shows that an additional structure or awning has been constructed behind 4 Burleigh Street (Figure 10). The aerial image from 2024 shows that the structure on the eastern boundary visible in the 1975 aerial and all the buildings at 2-4 Burleigh have been demolished, and the concreted surfaces within this area have been removed (Figure 11).

Geotechnical Investigation

Geotechnical investigations were conducted within the Project Area on 25 November 2024 by Green Geotechnics Pty Ltd. One borehole was drilled behind the building at 2 Burleigh Street, to a depth of 19m below the ground surface (Green Geotechnics 2024:2) (Figure 12). The results provide an indication of potential historical disturbance from previous land use, but cannot detect the presence or absence of Aboriginal sites.

Overall, the investigation found asphalt between 0-0.1m below ground level, overlying a fill of sandy gravel at a depth of 0.1-0.2m, overlying dark brown, medium plasticity silty clay topsoil at a depth of 0.2m-0.4m, overlying high/moderate-high plasticity orange/brown/grey silty clay soils at a depth of

2.2 Heritage Context

This section outlines the Aboriginal heritage context of the Project Area to provide an understanding of the extent, nature and location of known Aboriginal sites, previous investigations that have been undertaken and the implications for Aboriginal site patterning.

2.2.1 Archaeological Background

Australia and New Guinea were connected as a single continental landmass called Sahul and have been occupied by humans for at least 65,000 years (Clarkson et al. 2017). The east coast of NSW has been occupied from at least 50,000 years ago (Williams et al. 2017). Closer to the Project Area, sites have generally been dated to the Holocene (the last 10,000 years) (Table 1).

Studies from the western Cumberland Plain demonstrate that a large proportion of all recorded open sites (artefact scatters) are located close to rivers and creek lines, with over 65% being within 100m of a permanent water supply and a further 35% being within 300m of water (Kohen 1986:229; Attenbrow 2010:50). These patterns of site location have been generally supported by the findings of later studies. White and McDonald undertook an analysis of artefact distribution and density from excavations in north-west Sydney to develop a spatial distribution model of Aboriginal sites on the Cumberland Plain, proposing that the highest artefact densities occur on terraces and lower slopes associated with 2nd to 4th order streams, within 50m of 2nd order streams and 51-100m of 3rd and 4th order streams. Excavations in the vicinity of 1st order streams found no significant difference in artefact distribution with distance from water, with low average artefact density and sparse artefact distributions (with a mean density of 1 artefact/m²) (White and McDonald 2010).

An Aboriginal heritage study was conducted by Rich (1986) across the municipalities of Burwood and Strathfield, encompassing the suburbs of Burwood, Strathfield, Strathfield West, South Strathfield, Homebush, Homebush West, Croydon, Croydon Park and Enfield. The current Project Area is located within this study area. Due to the geology of the area, it was considered possible that there were natural silcrete and basalt/breccia outcrops that past Aboriginal people may have utilised for stone tools. It was predicted that past Aboriginal site occupation would have likely followed the site catchment model, where resources are exploited from around a home base. As Burwood and Strathfield municipalities are highly developed residential areas with any areas of open space likely to have been disturbed and modified for recreation, such as parks and sporting facilities, it was considered there are no undisturbed areas within these municipalities, and therefore it was unlikely for Aboriginal sites to remain (Rich 1986).

Virtus (2024) Archaeological Survey, 28-34 Victoria Street, 17 and 21 George Street, Burwood

A study area encompassing properties at 28-24 Victoria Street and 17 and 21 George Street was surveyed, approximately 170m north of the current Project Area. At 28-34 Victoria Street, the study area had already been excavated down five levels to bedrock, and all soil had been removed. At 21 George Street, there was an existing 1.5 level carpark, that had cut into the natural slope. At

17 George Street, the existing unit block had been demolished, and excavations to remove the building's foundations and underground services extended down to a depth of 6m. This was then backfilled with rock and road base. The entire study area was considered to be heavily modified, with a low likelihood of Aboriginal artefacts or sites remaining (Virtus Heritage Pty Ltd 2024).

Comber (2009) Archaeological Survey, Sydney Metro Network Stage 2 (Central-Westmead)

Investigations were conducted for the proposed Central to Westmead Metro line, which was to involve the installation of a 25km rail line and 11 new stations. As the line would be constructed at a depth underground that would not impact any above- or below-ground Aboriginal sites, the focus of this investigation was on areas that would be impacted by the construction of the new stations or worksites. Relevant to the current Project Area is the proposed Burwood Metro station and worksites, located approximately 560m north of the Project Area.

A survey of the station and worksite locations did not identify any surface artefacts or sites, and these locations were generally all considered to be greatly disturbed. At the proposed location of the Burwood Metro station, the area was considered to be too disturbed from residential buildings, roads, and the installation of associated services for any subsurface Aboriginal heritage deposits to be remain. The worksite location at Rosehill extended into part of a registered artefact scatter site (AHIMS 45-6-2559), which was assessed as likely to have a subsurface deposit, and therefore subsurface investigation was recommended. The location of the proposed Parramatta Metro station had previously been investigated, and further testing of this area was also recommended (Comber 2009).

Cultural Heritage Connections (2018) Archaeological Survey, Croydon Public School, Croydon

The grounds of Croydon Public School at 39 Young Street, Croydon, were investigated for a proposed upgrade to the school's buildings. This study area is located approximately 870m east of the current Project Area. Although the survey encountered poor visibility, the study area was found to be heavily disturbed, with parts affected by the brickworks quarry immediately to the west. No Aboriginal sites or artefacts were identified and due to the disturbance, the study area was considered to have low archaeological potential (Cultural Heritage Connections 2018).

Eco Logical Australia (2019) Archaeological Survey, Meriden School for Girls, Strathfield

Three study areas at the Meriden School for Girls were investigated as part of works to improve the school's facilities. Site 1 was the music building at the Meriden Senior School Campus at 13 Margaret Street, Site 2 was the business office building at Lingwood Prep School at 16 Margaret Street and Site 3 was the residential dwelling at Meriden Junior School at 4 Vernon Street. These study areas are approximately 1.16km west of the Project Area.

A pedestrian survey was undertaken, with exposures only visible in garden beds and from fill soils. The study areas were considered to be heavily disturbed from the development of the school campuses, and no Aboriginal artefacts or sites were identified (Eco Logical Australia 2019).

2.2.2 Aboriginal Heritage Information Management System (AHIMS)

Aboriginal sites recorded in NSW are registered with geographic co-ordinates in the Aboriginal Heritage Information Management System (AHIMS) and are protected under the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974*. Data in AHIMS can provide information on Aboriginal site patterning, as well as showing if Aboriginal sites occur in the Project Area.

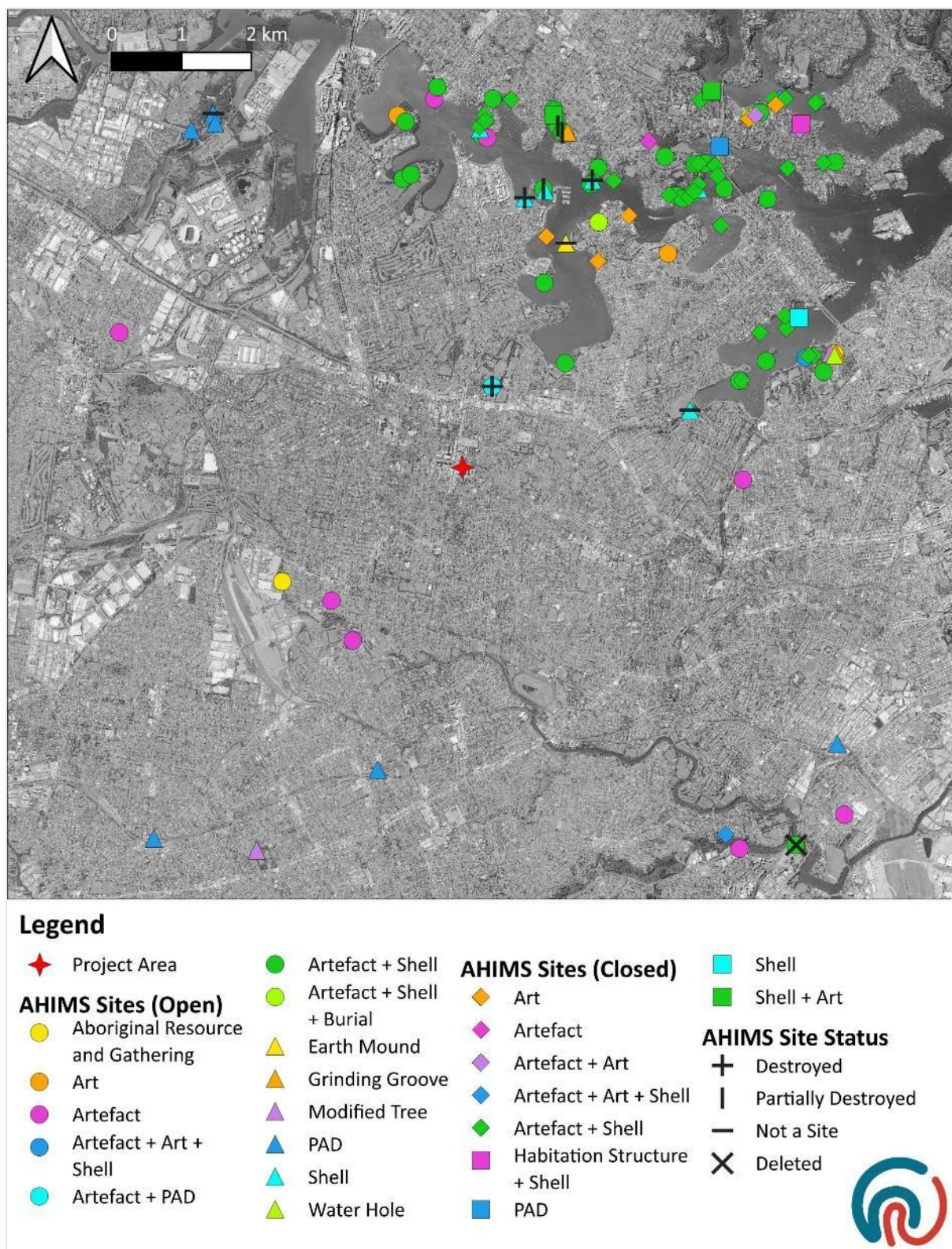


Figure 13. AHIMS search results. (Source: Imagery © SCP 2020 with Heritage Now and AHIMS additions)

An extensive search of AHIMS was undertaken on 21 December 2024 using coordinates GDA, Zone 56, Eastings 319230 to 330230 and Northings 6244270 to 6255270 (Attachment 1). The search produced a result of 118 sites, the majority of which have been identified in open contexts (56%) (Figure 13). Of these, three sites have been destroyed, three have been partially destroyed, one site has been deleted and three have been classified as not archaeological sites.

Around 71.5% of the total number of sites contain stone artefacts, and are generally identified within 200m of a water source. Stone artefacts often dominate the archaeological record because they are preserved well in comparison to other materials such as bone implements, clothing, ornamentation, medicinal supplies, woven goods and wooden weapons used by Aboriginal people.

Sites containing both artefacts and shell have been registered in close proximity to the Parramatta River and the bays that branch from it, which is to be expected given the shell resources available from these water sources. Closed context sites (rock shelters), art (engraving) and grinding groove sites have been identified in areas where Hawkesbury sandstone geology is present, adjacent to parts of the Parramatta River.

Other site features recorded in the region include Potential Archaeological Deposits (PADs), modified trees, Aboriginal resource and gathering sites, burials, a water hole and a habitation structure (Table 2).

2.3 Synthesis

The heritage context and environmental context of the Project Area indicates that the most likely site types to occur in the Project Area are those related to occasional, short-term or temporary use of the land as Aboriginal people passed through the area and took advantage of what resources were available, such as low density artefact sites. A search of the AHIMS database indicates that there are no previously registered Aboriginal sites within the Project Area or its vicinity; the nearest site is an artefact and PAD site located approximately 1.2km north, in the carpark at Concord Oval.

The Project Area is situated on a midslope landform, which historically may have been located within 100m of a 1st order stream. However, the land-use analysis suggests that the Project Area has been disturbed by the construction of the buildings and the installation of associated services and driveways/parking lots, with geotechnical investigations suggesting that beneath the asphalted surface in the south-east of the property, only approximately 20cm of topsoil may remain, beneath fill that has been introduced for laying of the asphalt. Previous investigations in the vicinity suggest that the Burwood area is too disturbed to contain any intact subsurface archaeological deposits, and investigations in the northwestern Cumberland Plain have identified only low average artefact density and sparse artefact distributions in the vicinity of 1st order streams.

3 Visual Inspection

A visual inspection of the Project Area was undertaken on 16 January 2025 by Tiffany Jones (Heritage Now) and Justine Coplin (Darug Custodian Aboriginal Corporation). The purpose of the inspection was to identify material evidence for Aboriginal occupation on the surface, as well as provide an assessment of archaeological potential – the non-visible material traces or evidence of Aboriginal land use which have a likelihood of being present under the ground surface (DECCW 2010:12).

3.1 Results

No Aboriginal sites, objects or Potential Archaeological Deposits (PADs) were identified within the Project Area during the pedestrian inspection. While ground surface visibility in the northern portion of the Project Area was restricted due to existing buildings and a concreted driveway and parking lot (Plate 1), subsurface archaeological potential in this area is assessed to be low due to these historical disturbances. Due to the slope towards Railway Parade, the front of these buildings has been somewhat built up (Plate 2-Plate 3), and therefore it is possible that topsoil from the slope behind would have been removed to provide a level surface for these buildings. In this northern area, some ground surface was visible within garden beds at the front of these buildings, but was largely obscured by leaf litter and wood chip mulch (Plate 4). Some ground surface was also visible within a partly damaged concrete driveway on the western boundary of the Project Area, where dark sandy fill soil, a service line, tree roots and foundation bricks for a boundary wall were visible disturbances (Plate 5-Plate 6).

The ground surface of the southern portion of the Project Area was almost entirely exposed, following demolition of the two buildings facing Burleigh Street (Plate 7-Plate 8), with one remnant area of asphalt, previously used for vehicle parking behind 2 Burleigh Street (Plate 9). A small section of wall from the buildings at 2-4 Burleigh Street remains, however the depth of these building foundations is unknown (Plate 10-Plate 13). Despite good visibility, no evidence of Aboriginal objects was found during inspection of the ground surface in the southern portion of the Project Area, and subsurface archaeological potential in this area is assessed to be low due to disturbance from the buildings and associated services.

3.1.1 Aboriginal Consultation

Justine Coplin of Darug Custodian Aboriginal Corporation stated that she would like the Project Area to be subject to subsurface archaeological testing, due to the close proximity of waterways marked on the parish maps (eg. Figure 5).

The archaeological assessment by Heritage Now has considered: previous Cumberland Plain investigations which have identified only low average artefact density and sparse artefact distributions in the vicinity of 1st order streams, the geotechnical investigation revealing relatively shallow topsoil, and the degree of disturbance caused by construction and demolition of buildings, asphalt and other services (on a slope landform which would have been modified to provide a level surface for these buildings). On the basis of these factors the subsurface archaeological potential in the Project Area is assessed by Heritage Now to be low.

3.2 Summary

The inspection confirmed that the Project Area has been subject to ground disturbance, and no Aboriginal sites, objects or Potential Archaeological Deposits (PADs) were identified. Based on

previous Cumberland Plain investigations which have identified only low average artefact density and sparse artefact distributions in the vicinity of 1st order streams, the geotechnical investigation revealing relatively shallow topsoil, and the degree of disturbance caused by construction and demolition of buildings, asphalt and other services (on a slope landform which would have been modified to provide a level surface for these buildings), subsurface archaeological potential in the Project Area is assessed to be low.

4 Conclusions and Recommendations

This section assesses the potential impact of the proposed works in relation to Aboriginal heritage objects in the Project Area.

4.1 Proposed Activity

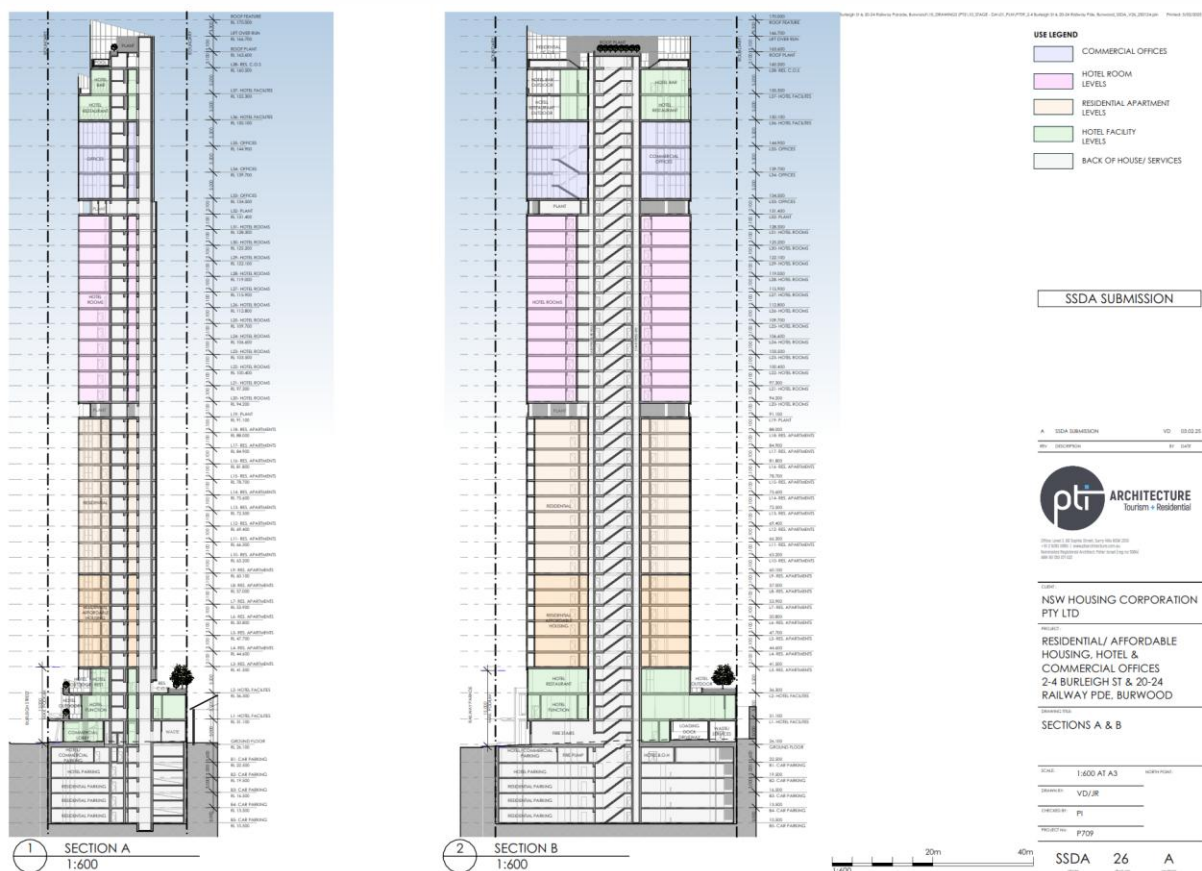


Figure 14. Vertical cross section of proposed building. (Source: PTI Architecture, 3/02/25)

The proposed works involve the demolition of the remaining buildings facing Railway Parade and the removal of concreted areas for the construction of a 39 storey residential, hotel and commercial office building (Figure 14). This building will have five levels of basements for parking, storage and services, which extend up to the boundary of the Project Area (Figure 15). The building will be serviced by lifts and contain other amenities such as function rooms, kitchens, gym and a pool.

4.2 Conclusions

No Aboriginal sites, objects or Potential Archaeological Deposits (PADs) have been identified within the Project Area. Based on previous Cumberland Plain investigations which have identified only low average artefact density and sparse artefact distributions in the vicinity of 1st order streams, the geotechnical investigation revealing relatively shallow topsoil, and the degree of disturbance caused by construction and demolition of buildings, asphalt and other services (on a slope landform which would have been modified to provide a level surface for these buildings), subsurface archaeological potential in the Project Area is assessed to be low.

4.3 Recommendations

Recommendation 1

All on-site personnel are to be made aware of their obligations under the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974*. This includes the protection of Aboriginal sites and the reporting of any new or suspected Aboriginal heritage sites. This may be done through an on-site Aboriginal cultural heritage induction or other suitable format.

Recommendation 2

In the unlikely event that Aboriginal, or suspected Aboriginal, archaeological material is uncovered during the development, then works in that area are to stop and the area is to be cordoned off. The project manager is to contact the heritage consultant to make an assessment as to whether the material is classed as Aboriginal object/s under the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974*, and advise on the required management and mitigation measures. Works are not to recommence in the

cordoned off area until heritage clearance has been given and/or the required management and mitigation measures have been implemented.

Recommendation 3

In the unlikely event that human remains, or suspected human remains, are uncovered during the development, works in that area are to stop and the area is to be cordoned off. The project manager is to contact the NSW Police to establish whether the area is a crime scene. If it is not a crime scene, and the remains are determined to be Aboriginal ancestral remains, Heritage NSW is to be notified via the Environment Line on 131 555 and management measures are to be devised in consultation with the local Aboriginal community. Works are not to recommence in the area until the management measures have been implemented.

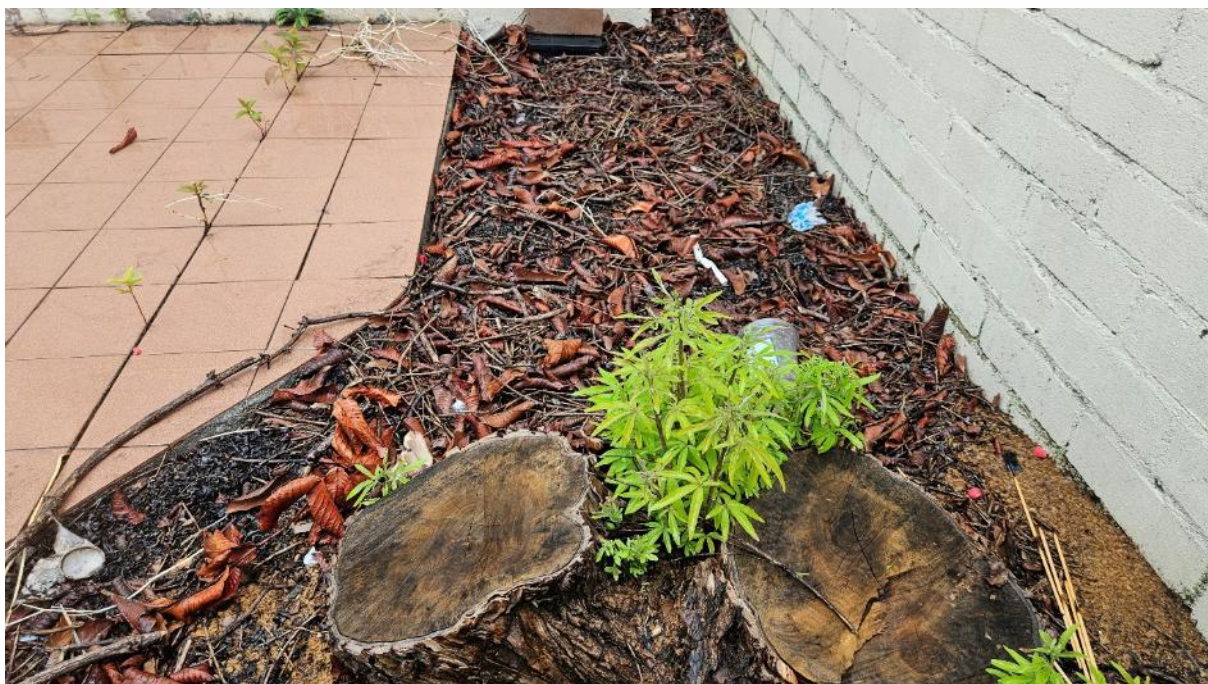

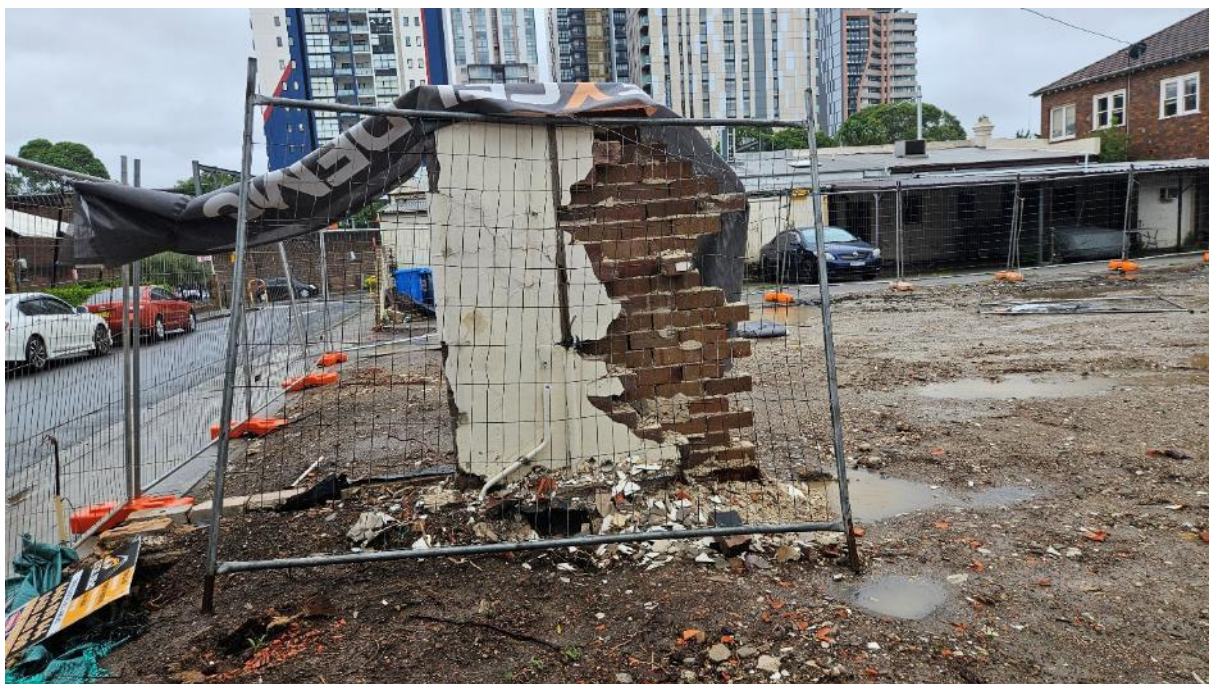
