565-601 AND 601A LUDDENHAM ROAD, LUDDENHAM NSW

Introduction

Celestino Developments SSP Pty Limited ('Celestino') are seeking to progress a State Significant Development Application (SSDA) under Part 4 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* (EP&A Act) for the proposed development (SSD-78774218) at 565-569, 601 and 601a Luddenham Road, Luddenham (known as Sydney Science Park). Secretary's Environmental Assessment Requirements (SEARs) for preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the proposal were issued by the Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure (DPHI) on 09 February 2025.

The Sydney Science Park SSD #1 site comprises 296.89 hectares across Lots 1, 2 and 3 DP 1276320 and Lot 206 DP 1280188 at 565-599, 601 and 601a Luddenham Road, Luddenham. The proposal comprises a concept proposal to guide the staged development of the site as well as a detailed proposal for the first stage of development.

The concept proposal applies to the entire site and comprises a Concept Plan for the following:

- A concept urban structure plan based on a site wide approach for the development of urban blocks/super lots, including site-wide open space and riparian corridors and key transport infrastructure links (sub-arterial, indicative collector and local roads, and associated intersections).
- Staging plan, setting out the development stages, and
- Guidelines for the future stages of development.

The first stage of development comprises the Stage 1 Precinct, Stage 1 Estate works and Stage 1 subdivision. The Stage 1 Precinct applies to part Lot 1 DP 1276320 and Lot 206 DP 1280188 and comprises the following:

- Clearing, bulk and detailed earthworks, including cut/fill, grading, and benching.
- Construction of structural support, including retaining walls and batters.
- Staged construction of civil and infrastructure works, including temporary works associated with roadworks and Integrated Water Cycle Management (IWCM).
- Landscaping and streetscape.
- Provision and augmentation of services (potable water, sewer, recycled water, electricity, and telecommunications), and
- Associated environmental management works, including erosion and sediment control.

The Stage 1 Estate works apply to Lots 1, 2 and 3 DP 1276320 and Lot 206 DP 1280188 and will be staged to comprise the following:

- Clearing and earthworks, including cut and fill, benching and stabilisation (batters and/or retaining walls) to achieve appropriate site levels across the site.
- Stormwater and other related civil work, including the provision of utility services.
- Public domain work such as the provision of footpaths from Stage Precinct 1 to the Metro Station and associated signage, and
- Internal reticulation of services and utilities, including connections to and from the existing Sydney Integrated Water Recycling Hub.

Stage 1 subdivision of Lots 1, 2 and 3 DP 1276320 and Lot 206 DP 1280188 will follow, creating five development lots and thirteen residue lots over four stages. The cadastral plan showing the extent of the Sydney Science Park SSD #1 development site is shown in Figure 1. The concept urban structure plan and Stage 1 Precinct extent is shown in Figure 2.

Sydney Science Park forms part of the Northern Gateway Precinct under the Western Sydney Aerotropolis Precinct Plan. The Western Sydney Aerotropolis Precinct Plan is in force under the provisions of *State Environmental Planning Policy [SEPP] (Precincts – Western Parkland City) 2021*, Chapter 4 Western Sydney Aerotropolis. This instrument replaces the earlier *SEPP (Western Sydney Aerotropolis) 2020*. A majority of the site is identified as Sydney Science Park pursuant to clause 4.28A of the Western Parkland City SEPP.

Current assessment context

Kelleher Nightingale Consulting Pty Ltd (KNC) has previously completed comprehensive Aboriginal archaeological and cultural heritage assessment for the overall Sydney Science Park development. This has included a full community consultation process with registered Aboriginal stakeholders in accordance with legislative requirements. For clarity, the existing Aboriginal heritage assessments for Sydney Science Park include the whole of the Sydney Science Park SSD #1 development site.

Two Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permits (AHIPs) have previously been sought and granted under s.90 of the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974* from the Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) [now Heritage NSW, part of the NSW Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (DCCEEW)]. These cover the majority of the site (refer Figure 4).

The SEARs for the current SSDA include requirements for the assessment of Aboriginal heritage:

The SEARs advice provided by DCCEEW Heritage referenced in Table 1 above comprises the following requirement, addressed in Appendix A to this letter:

Demonstrate the completion of all conditions of Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permits 4302 and 4663 including the provision of the salvage report/s.

The purpose of this letter is to outline the extensive investigations undertaken to date and demonstrate the completion of the AHIP conditions as required by the SEARs and in accordance with the Agency advice provided by DCCEEW.

Existing Aboriginal Heritage Assessments

The following assessments incorporate the Sydney Science Park SSD #1 site:

The existing Aboriginal heritage assessments for Sydney Science Park are compliant with relevant legislation and guidelines, including:

- *Code of Practice for archaeological investigation of Aboriginal objects in NSW* (OEH 2010a)
- *Guide to investigating, assessing and reporting on Aboriginal cultural heritage in NSW* (OEH 2011)
- *Aboriginal cultural heritage consultation requirements for proponents 2010* (OEH 2010b)
- *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974*
- *National Parks and Wildlife Regulation 2019*

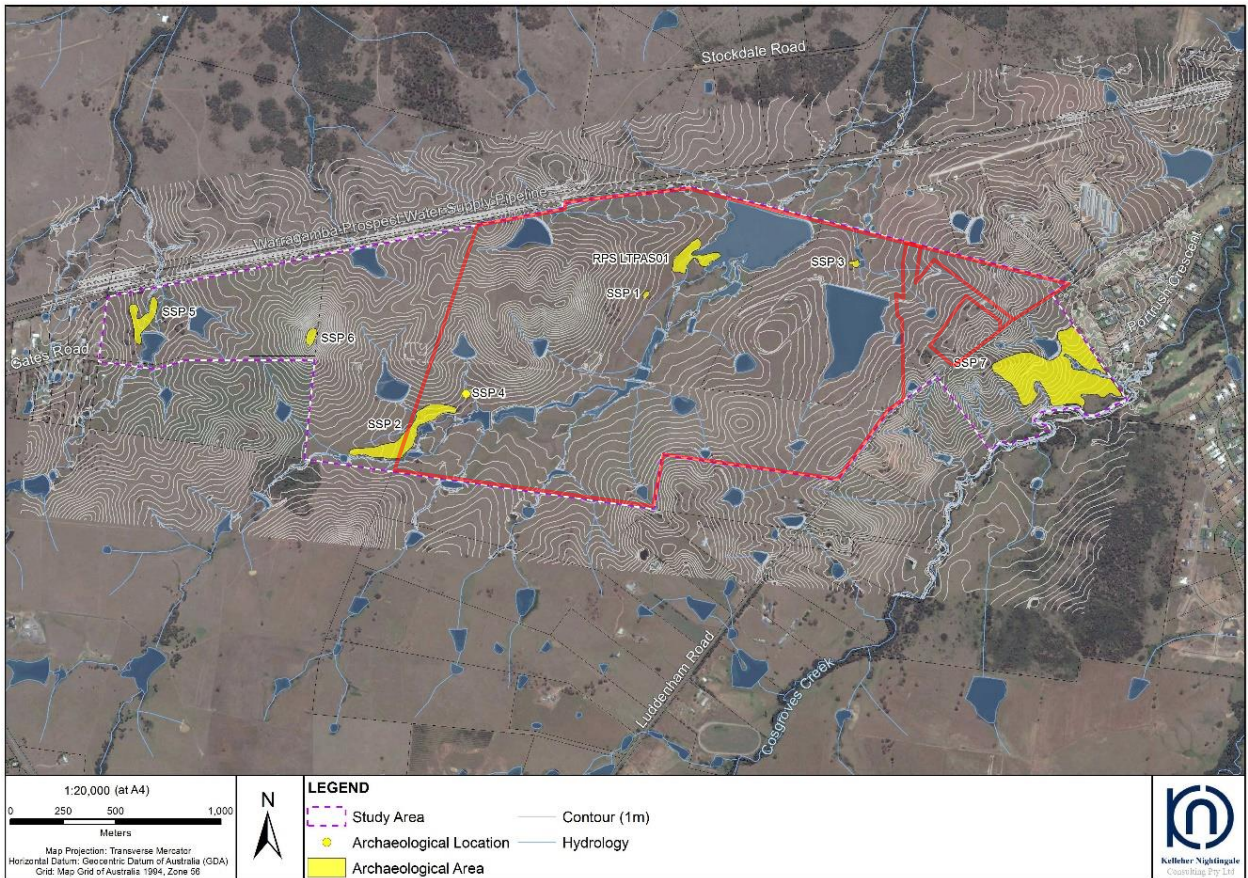


Figure 3. Sydney Science Park archaeological assessment study area and identified Aboriginal archaeological sites. SSDA site development boundary shown in red.

The Aboriginal heritage assessment undertaken for the initial planning proposal (KNC 2013) and the subsequent archaeological assessment and test excavation (KNC 2017) covered a large area which fully incorporates the current Sydney Science Park SSD #1 site (Figure 3). Five Aboriginal archaeological sites were identified within the Sydney Science Park SSD #1 area:

- RPS LTPAS01 (AHIMS 45-5-4189) – within Sydney Science Park initial rezoning area
- SSP 1 (AHIMS 45-5-4707) – within Sydney Science Park initial rezoning area
- SSP 3 (AHIMS 45-5-4709) – within Sydney Science Park initial rezoning area
- SSP 4 (AHIMS 45-5-4922) – within Sydney Science Park initial rezoning area
- SSP 2 (AHIMS 45-5-4708) – within adjacent local water centre facility

The archaeological sites included surface artefact scatters and an isolated find, associated with subsurface archaeological deposit of varying density and significance. Four archaeological sites were within the Sydney Science Park initial rezoning area with one further site within the adjacent local water centre area. Site locations are shown in Figure 3. Following the completion of the Aboriginal cultural heritage assessment process for Sydney Science Park and the local water centre, two Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permits (AHIPs) were sought under s.90 of the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974* from the Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) (now DCCEEW).

Completion of AHIP Conditions

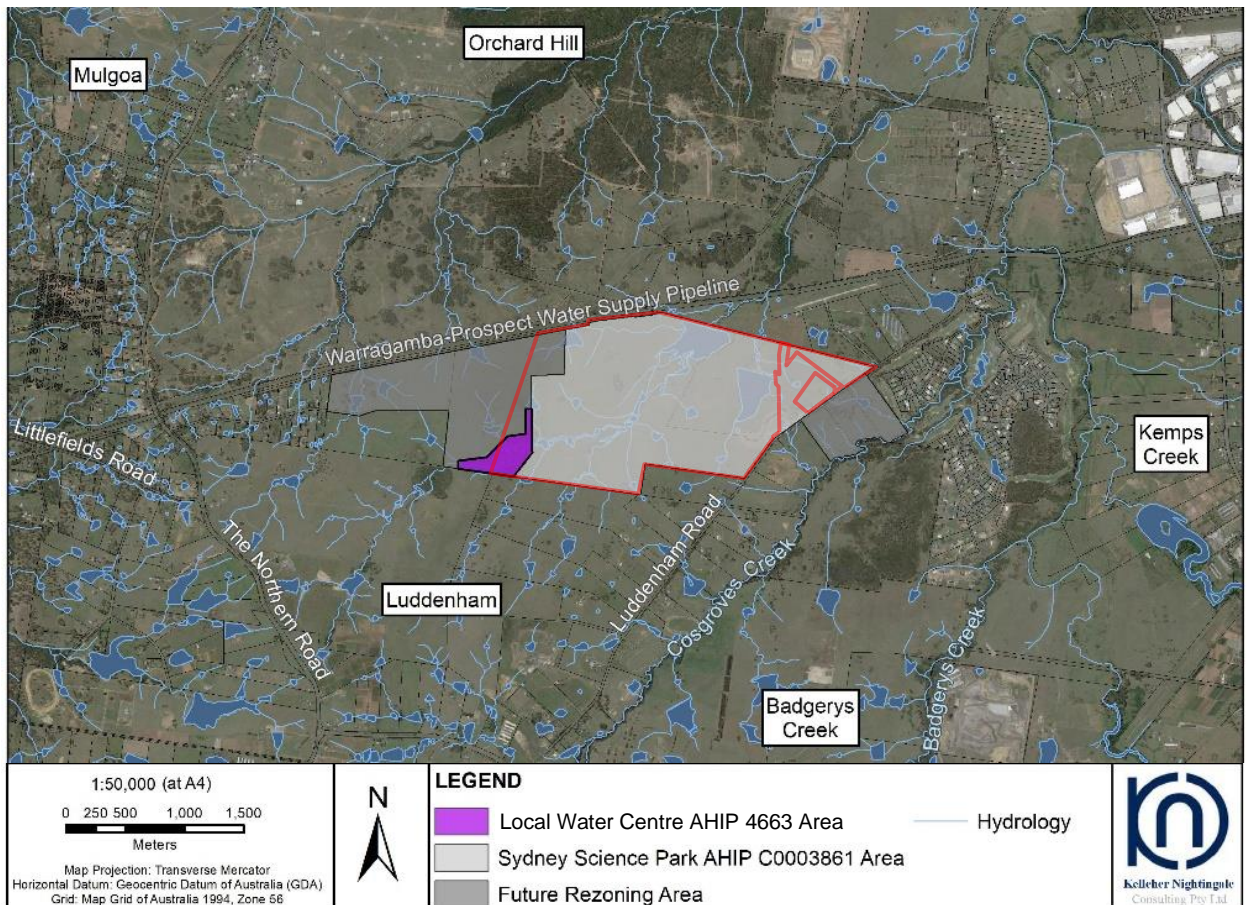


Figure 4. Sydney Science Park existing AHIP areas. SSDA site development boundary shown in red.

AHIP number C0003861 (AHIMS Permit ID 4302) was granted for the Sydney Science Park development on 23 July 2018 and AHIP number 4663 (AHIMS Permit ID 4663) was granted for the local water centre on 16 October 2020. The existing AHIPs cover the majority of the Sydney Science Park area (Figure 4) and allow for impact to identified Aboriginal archaeological sites and Aboriginal objects within their boundaries. These AHIPs are active and remain valid until 23 July 2028 and 16 October 2025, respectively. Celestino are in the process of seeking an AHIP variation for AHIP 4663 to extend the permit duration. The small portion of the Sydney Science Park SSD #1 site not covered by an existing AHIP contains no identified Aboriginal archaeological heritage and an AHIP is not required. The area has previously been comprehensively assessed and further investigation or preparation of an Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment Report (ACHAR) is not required. A heritage advice letter report detailing the Sydney Science Park assessment coverage and findings was prepared to support the request for SEARs for the current project and lodged with DPHI as part of that request (KNC 2024).

Both AHIPs included certain Conditions related to required Aboriginal heritage management activities. Tables 1 and 2 in Appendix A list all AHIP conditions and compliance statements. It is noted that the AHIP areas now incorporate lands outside the SSDA site due to changes in land ownership, including the Sydney Metro land (refer Figure 1).

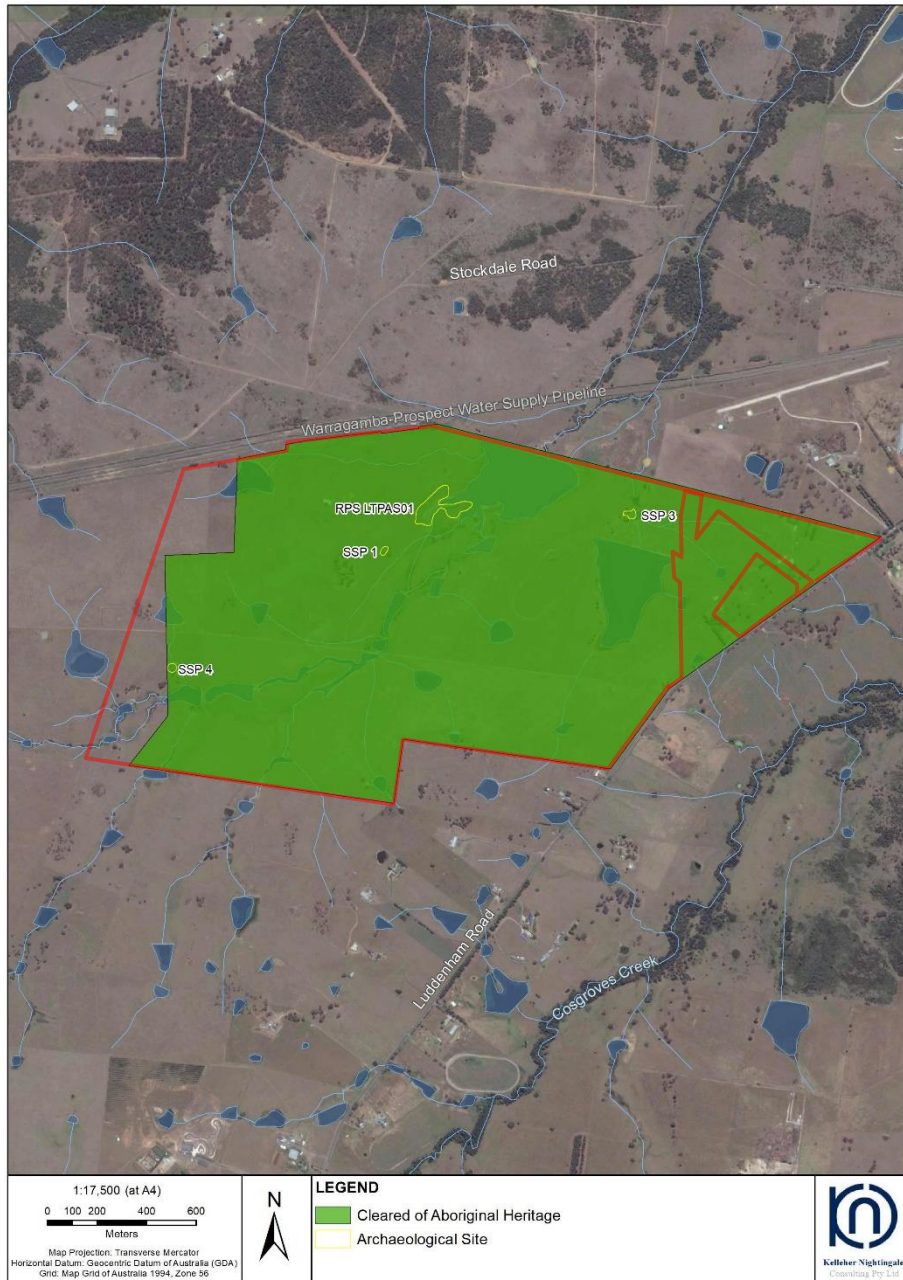


Figure 5. Area cleared of Aboriginal heritage (AHIP C0003861 Area), Sydney Science Park. SSSA site development boundary shown in red.

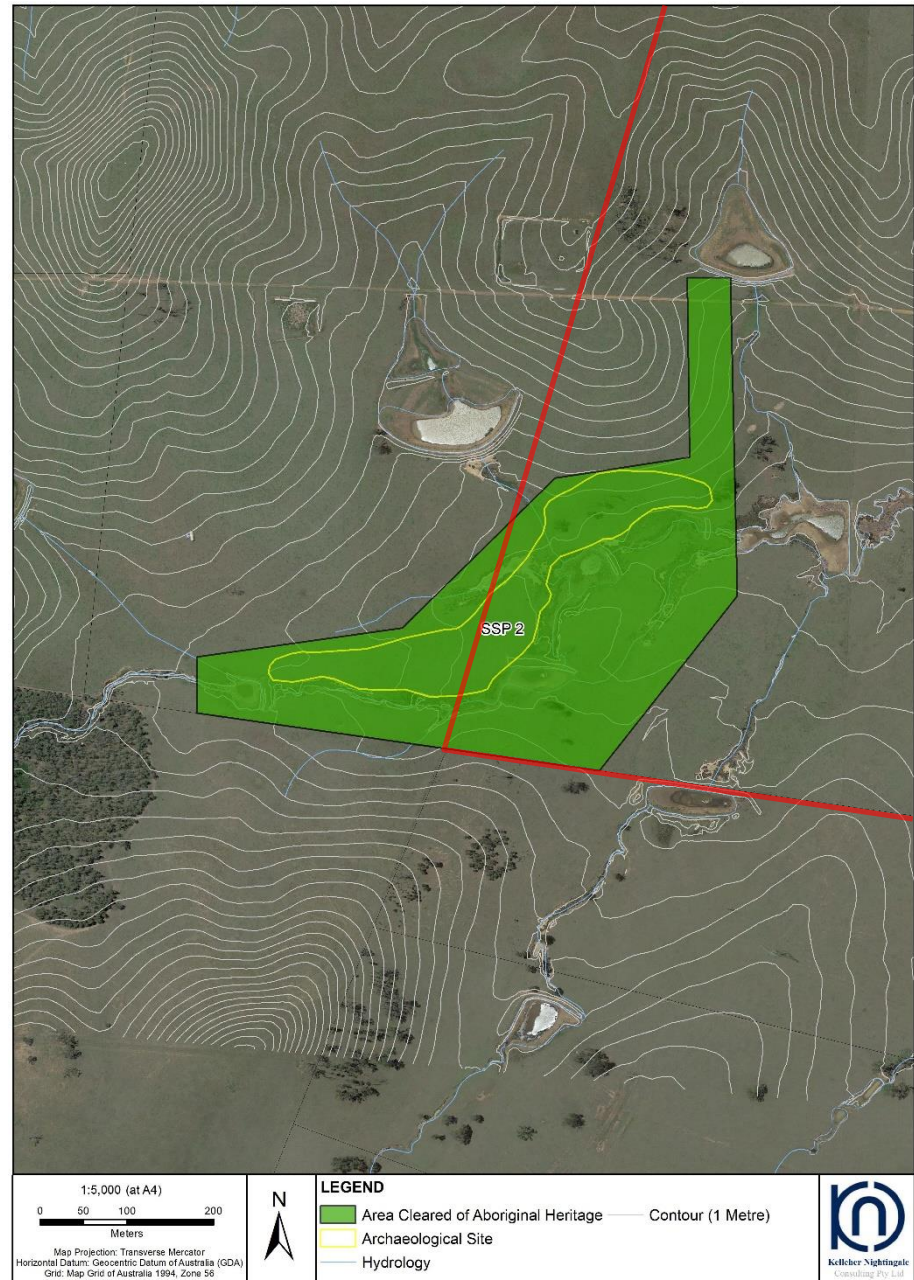


Figure 6. Area cleared of Aboriginal heritage (AHIP 4663 Area), Local Water Centre. SSSA site development boundary shown in red.

All mitigation and reporting activities are complete and no further assessment or consideration of Aboriginal archaeological heritage is required for the existing AHIP areas (Figures 5 and 6).

Conclusion and Recommendations

The Sydney Science Park SSD #1 site has been subject to detailed and comprehensive Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal heritage assessment as part of the wider Sydney Science Park planning and development process.

Aboriginal heritage assessment has included a full consultation process with registered Aboriginal stakeholders. Existing AHIPs C0003861 and 4663 are active over the majority of the SSD area and allow for work associated with the proposed Sydney Science Park development. Mitigation conditions associated with both AHIPs have been completed and the relevant archaeological sites are now listed as Destroyed. Appendix A provides compliance statements for each AHIP condition as required under the project SEARs.

No remaining Aboriginal archaeological sites or areas of potential exist within the SSD development boundary. The small portion of the Sydney Science Park SSD #1 site outside of the existing AHIP extents does not contain any identified Aboriginal heritage and further assessment or preparation of an ACHAR is not required.

On this basis, and in accordance with the SEARs, it is considered that no further Aboriginal heritage assessment of the Sydney Science Park SSD #1 proposal is warranted.
