I wish to object to the proposed development of 201 Elizabeth St, Sydney for the following reasons:

Visual Impact.: Complete Loss of iconic views to Hyde Park, St. Mary's Cathedral and Sydney Harbour.

Historical and Cultural impact: Loss of Connectivity to the heart of the city as new building will completely block views of Historic sites such as St Mary's Cathedral and Events held in Hyde Park such as Anzac Day March, Noodle markets and Sydney Festival to name a few.

Loss of Amenity: Complete loss of natural sunlight to living areas and private open balconies. Increased overshadowing.

Loss of Privacy: Due to proposed hotel use.

Accessibility: It is already extremely difficult to safely drive into and away from Victoria Towers now with the closure of George St. As Castlereagh Street is a main bus route and stop, the proposed building would have a negative impact on public transport with greater street blockages of Castlereagh, Park and Elizabeth streets.
