DECLARATION OF STATE SIGNIFICANT INFRASTRUCTURE AND CRITICAL STATE SIGNIFICANT INFRASTRUCTURE

Decision

On 19 June 2024, the Minister for Planning and Public Spaces declared the Lake Lyell Pumped Hydro Project as State Significant Infrastructure (SSI) and Critical State Significant Infrastructure (CSSI) in accordance with s 5.12 (4) and 5.13 of the EP&A Act.

Key reasons

The Lake Lyell Pumped Hydro Project has been declared SSI and CSSI because the Minister for Planning and Public Spaces considered that the Project is essential to NSW for economic, social and environmental reasons as it would:

- Provide 335 MW of reliable and dispatchable energy solar or wind are unavailable and contributes to NSW Government's aim to establish a pipeline of up to 3GW of pumped hydro.
- Take advantage of existing infrastructure associated with Mount Piper power station, offering a lower impact alternative to a greenfield project.
- Inject capital expenditure into the region of around \$1 billion and the creation of hundreds of construction and ongoing jobs in regional NSW.
- Assist NSW (and Australia) in meeting its target of net zero emissions by 2050.
- Contribute to the substantial economic and social benefits for NSW that will be delivered by the NSW Government's Electricity Infrastructure Roadmap.

The considerations taken into account when making the Declaration are consistent with the principles outlined in the '*Declaration of SSI and CSSI- State Significant Infrastructure Guide*' March 2021 published on the NSW Planning website [here](#).
