I would like to strongly state that Inland Rail are still not listening, as they have not been since 2018, when Narrabri residents stated that they should not be constructing this structure on a major floodplain which affects Narrabri flooding.

There is no need to come through town causing noise and vibration, construction traffic in aged care and hospital areas. But worst of all, even a small increase in flooding, means extra time while water recedes and a clean up can start.

There is an alternative route, which will not affect the flooding of Narrabri.
