(Page 565 of 599) Figure 7-2 map reference 69-70</u> <u>YELLOW LINE</u>: Transgrid LINE CLEARING Ancient PADDOCK TREES. Over 300 tree line protection corridors, plus additional tree line cleared for construction. Large span <u>RED LINE</u>: re-alignment <u>narrow</u> Derringullen Creek crossing, low impact, accessible easement. DARK BLUE ARROW: NARROW CREEK CROSSING LIGHT BLUE ARROW: Derringullen falls

2.3. Derringullen Falls Cultural Heritage Sensitive Area

YELLOW LINE: TRANSGRID Broadest crossing waterway, cutting conservation land in half.

**GREEN CIRCLE:** Kurrajong tree reference point

## 2.4. Realignment, Conservation Land and Derringullen Falls



RED LINE – RE-ALIGNMENT Avoids: 110ha of conservation land, Derringullen Falls and cultural Heritage site. Less tree clearing overall and ecological impact. GREEN CIRCLE: reference high point maps, kurrajong tree 2.5. Kurrajong Tree and Realignment of Box Woodland



RED LINE: re-alignment behind the box woodland GREEN CIRCLE: Kurrajong tree high point of reference, maps

## **3.2 Derringullen Creek**



YELLOW LINE: 500KV Transmission Line. -<u>LARGE DESTRUCTIVE SPAN OVER</u> <u>DERRINGULLEN CREEK. MULTIPLE HOLLOW TREES CLEARED</u> PURPLE TRIANGLES – LOWER, MID AND TOP LOOK OUT POINTS WALKING TRACKS LIGHT GREEN BOX: PICNIC AREA AND WALKING TRACK. BLUE ARROW: DERRINGULLEN FALLS PINK ARROW NGUNNAWAL CULTURAL HERITAGE SITE GREEN CIRCLE: WEDGE-TAILED EAGLES TREE/NEST GREEN ARROW: LITTLE EAGLE AND OVER RIDGE LINE, and BOWNING CREEK, 40 HOLLOW TREES CLEARED (both Creeks 500-600m from Yass River)
