We have attended every Public Meeting provided, for consultation with the Developer and it certainly ~~affirms~~ shows our serious concerns of the Height, privacy and flooding impact on our lives, have been ignored. How would they feel if a developer was to impact their lifestyle, as this will impact ours, having lived in 6 Beach St Kingscliff for 47 years.

## Privacy

Our common boundary with this overdevelopment, is 48 metres. ~~Even~~ we have 3 Aged Care clients in a 1 bedroom unit in the current facility, but with the proposed 23, two and three bedroom, plus study units to accommodate Block E, our entire backyard and home will be overlooked by the possibility of up to 46 new residents.

My husband and I will be significantly impacted.

The Block E north facing 'Apartments' have large balconies with glass balustrades and the high end finishes often mentioned by Uniting, is not exactly affordable living. With 23 apartments facing us, the lighting from the balconies and dwellings will be most intrusive.

material to be used along our boundary. Also the walkway will obviously have many of the residences using it.

There will be significant noise from the 77 underground carpark, on our existing boundary

• Height

I object to the fact that the height of Building E will be 16.75 meters above ~~the~~ <sup>existing</sup> RL level. The Tweed Shire Council <sup>currently</sup> has a height limit and ~~therefore~~ <sup>cannot</sup> ~~allow~~ this. Development Application is out of character with the current Kingscliff Village.

## FLOODING

PLA - DRW - DA - E 300

Building E shows a cross section with ground levels between my residence and the proposed building on the same level, which is totally inaccurate as my block is already a meter lower than the present Nursing Home side.

- How does the proposed Development prevent runoff from their site, ~~from~~ to my backyard; there is no drainage provision indicated.
- In the 2022 flood water from the present Nursing Home killed my backyard to more than a metre in depth.

Beach St is already a major throughfare to the New Tweed Valley hospital and with the construction vehicles and tradesmen to use Beach St, it will only add more pressure to the existing congestion.

- PARKING

There is no on street parking available in Beach St of an evening at present and with this proposed development the threat of tradesmen needing parking during construction is a huge concern.

There is very limited ~~on~~ parking for the Aged in our Business and shopping Precinct without the influx of ~~the~~ the significant number of proposed new residents.

The influx of 100 + residents in this compact site will certainly stretch to current services and amenities of Kingscliff. Our local area is in need of more aged care and I strongly object to the proposed development of 199 two, three bedroom units.
