Optimising Sydney's Powerhouse Museum's exhibition, education and event spaces, could transform the building and precinct into a lively, creative and activated space in NSW accentuated by its proximity to the public transport network and Sydney CBD. Forward thinking is required instead of ready-made plans summarily downsizing it.

Consider for a moment the possibility of <u>a Sydney Children's Creativity Museum on the scale of San Francisco's</u>.
