Is the Timberyards development in Marrickville 'Build to Rent' or 'Build to Fail?'

As designed it will not solve the housing affordability problem. It does not provide appropriate affordable housing for people who want to live in the area.

- RTL Co. (Scape) currently charge \$809+/week for students to live in a studio (15sqm) - How affordable will the proposed 873 units (coliving, studio and 1 bedroom) be for people wanting to live there?
- 2. Only 40 out of the total 1,188 proposed units are 3 bedroom (only 3% of the unit mix!) Where will families live? How much rent will they pay? What happened to flatmates and house sharing?
- 3. The developer is asking the NSW government for 20% bonus (floor space area and height) because they are 'building affordable housing' but less than 10% of the units are affordable (rent pegged to household income). I think the developer can do better!
- 4. The developer wants **7 buildings**, the smallest being 8 storeys and the tallest 13 storeys. **One of the buildings is on land only zoned for 3 storeys, so why is this allowed?**
- 5. How will future residents get to the station when **Sydenham Rd (State Government managed road) is in a terrible state** for pedestrians and cyclists?
