To Whom It May Concern Dear Sir/Madam,

RE: LETTER OF OBJECTION - DA35/98

MOD 6 CHLORINE LIQUEFACTION PLANT

On behalf of our members, I strongly object to the proposed modification of DA 35/98 for the chlorine plant in the Botany Industrial Park. The original approval in 1998 did not properly assess transport risks, so the consent was flawed.

Chlorine is highly toxic and transported daily along Denison Street, Wentworth Avenue and Bunnerong Road, putting local residents, shoppers and road users at risk.

A 2019 risk assessment showed unacceptable fatality risks, but further studies recommended by independent experts were never conducted.

Unlike similar chlorine plants in Victoria, there are no buffer zones or safeguards to protect residents here.

In the interest of public safety, the plant should not be expanded or modified — it should be relocated away from residential areas.

I urge you to refuse this modification and act to protect the safety of our community.
