The Statement of Environmental Effects (SEE) must include:  a description of the existing and approved operations/facilities on site, including all the statutory approvals that apply to these operations and associated environmental management/monitoring plans;  a detailed description of the proposal, including the:  need for the proposal;  alternatives considered;  plans for any new building works;  the revised operations on site (incorporating the proposal);  consideration of the proposal against the relevant statutory provisions, including whether it is consistent with the objects of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979;  a general overview of the environmental impacts of the proposal, identifying the key issues for further assessment;  a detailed assessment of the key issues specified below, and any other significant issues identified in the general overview of environmental impacts of the proposal (see above), which includes:  a description of the existing environment;  an assessment of the potential impacts of the proposal and the revised operations on site, including any potential cumulative impacts;  a description of the measures that would be implemented to avoid, minimise, mitigate, offset, manage and/or monitor the impacts of the proposal;  a summary of the management plans and monitoring programs at the facility, and a description of the proposed changes to these plans/programs to accommodate the proposal, taking into consideration its costs and benefits and the suitability of the site; and  a signed statement from the author of the SEE certifying that the information contained in the report is neither false nor misleading.

The SEE must take into account relevant State government technical and policy guidelines, as well as industry guidelines. While not exhaustive, guidelines which may be relevant to the project are included in the attached ists.
During the preparation of the SEE, you should consult with the relevant local, State or Commonwealth government authorities, service providers, community groups or affected landowners. The consultation process and the ssues raised must be described in the SEE.  In particular, you should consult with:  In NSW Maritime;  Hornsby City Council;
