Reasons for decision

The following matters were taken into consideration in making this decision:

- the relevant matters listed in section 4.15 of the Act and the additional matters listed in the statutory context section of the Department's Assessment Report;
- the prescribed matters under the Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2000;
- the reasons given by the consent authority for the grant of the original consent;
- the objects of the Act;
- all information submitted with the modification application during the assessment and information considered in the Department's Assessment Report;
- the findings and recommendations in the Department's Assessment Report;
- the submissions made concerning the modification; and
- the views of the community about the project (see Attachment 1).

The findings and recommendations set out in the Department's Assessment Report were accepted and adopted as the reasons for making this decision.

The decision maker was satisfied that the development to which the consent as modified relates is substantially the same development as the development for which consent was originally granted

The key reasons for granting the modification are as follows:

- the additional workers would enable additional underground safety works to be undertaken, whilst maintaining production levels at approved levels:
- it is consistent with NSW Government policy and the modification is permissible with development consent;
- any residual impacts can be appropriately minimised and managed under the conditions of consent;
- issues raised by the community during consultation and in submissions have been considered and appropriately addressed where relevant through recommended conditions of consent; and
- weighing all relevant considerations, the modification is in the public interest.

Attachment 1 - Consideration of Community Views

The Department exhibited the modification from 6 July 2019 to 24 July 2019 (19 days) and received one submission from the community.
