I support the above proposal to replace the integrated housing lots with low density housing lots provided the Amended Vegetation Management Plan is strictly adhered to by the Developer. There has already been a lot of vegetation in the Conservation Zone destroyed. This has been reported to the Eurobodalla Shire Council by the Tomakin Community Association and they do seem to be very concerned. However once the bulldozer/slasher has been through it is too late. The Association still wants to know why your Department has permitted development so close to the Littoral Rainforest. Your own Guidelines state that a 100 metre buffer is necessary around the gazetted SEPP Rainforest which is supposedly an area of significance. One of the integrated housing lots seems to be very close to the Rainforest and is well back within the area designated Conservation Zone. I am concerned that without some form of physical protection ie temporary fencing, then one day the bulldozer will go through to clear the area approved but will also clear anything and everything nearby(as has already happened in several places).

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
