How will these saplings be watered (given our lack of rain and water restrictions)? What will become of all the wildlife that is currently living in this forest of trees - it appears that the Government, yet again, doesn't care and the most important thing, despite Government website blurb, is development at all costs.

Many long term residents in my suburb and surrounds (including me) are disgusted with the level of development and tree canopy loss and have either moved away from Sydney or are planning to. I also note there is a large amount of people opposed to this development and loss of trees. Will this be taken into account? Unfortunately probably not.
