Cowal Gold Mine (DA 14/98 MOD 13) Comment on the Environmental Assessment

I refer to your email of 18 November 2016 to the Department of Primary Industries (DPI) in respect to the above matter. Comment has been sought from relevant divisions of DPI. Views were also sought from NSW Department of Industry - Lands that are now a division of the broader Department and no longer within NSW DPI.

DPI has reviewed the application and Environmental Assessment and provides the following recommendations:

- Prior to project approval the proponent should prepare graphical plots depicting concentration versus time of dissolved arsenic and cyanide for bores with detectable concentrations of these analytes at the mine site. These plots are considered important to determine that significant concentrations have not leached from the Tailings Storage Facilities into surrounding groundwater.
- The proponent should update the existing Water Management Plan in consultation with DPI Water. This should include addressing changes to surface water management within the site and the development of trigger levels and contingency measures for rising groundwater levels near the Tailings Storage Facilities.
- The proponent should continue to monitor groundwater quality at the project site to assess any impact on groundwater quality in the vicinity of the pit void.
- Options for the final landform should include minimising the ongoing runoff from clean areas into the void. This will enable diversion back into the natural surface water system and reduce the potential for water licensing requirements.
- The proponent should develop a stabilised surface water management system for the final landform that is consistent with DPI Water <u>Guidelines for Controlled Activities on</u> <u>Waterfront Land (2012)</u>.
