Thank you for the request for advice from Public Authority Consultation, requesting the review by the Environment Protection Authority (EPA) of the Statement of Environmental Effects (SEE) for the proposed modification of the Chain Valley Colliery (Application SSD-5465-Mod-4) at Ruttleys Road, Mannering Park.

The EPA has reviewed the document *Delta Coal, Chain Valley Colliery Modification 4, Statement of Environmental Effects* – Umwelt, Environmental & Social Consultants – November 2020.

The EPA understand the proposal is for:

- An extention of the current Chain Valley Colliery mining operational area boundary to incorporate the Northern Mining Area and permit the transfer of coal mined from the Northern Mining Area to the surface via Chain Valley Bay's operations.
- No other changes are proposed, including no change to the mining method, approved subsidence impacts, production rates or surface facilities.
