th a	e are extremely worried about the potential health impacts, with so much contradictory information out ere regarding this, and having a young family with young children with the world put my families and my neighbours families alth at risk.

	Destruction of flora and fauna A major concern is the Gillinghall RD which is one of the major routes for the vehicles and machinery used to construct and maintain the wind farm, in fact Infigen is predicting approximately 200 plus vehicle movements per day during the construction phase and the need to significantly widen and recontruct in many areas. The Gillinghall road is a natural wildlife corridor, heavily timbered with open country either side, there is around a 6km stretch of this road that is a haven for wallabies, echidna's, koala's, quoll's etc. The widening and reconstruction as well as a 50 fold increase in traffic movements (the road at the moment has around 6-10 movements per day) would in my opinion devastate this natural habitat and majority of the native animals within.
