The local tip is even further out of town than the waste station, I do not understand why you would want to bring all those contaminants on the doorsteps of loyal Gunnedah citizens. If the waste station is 100% safe for its own workers and community, why wont the owner answer any questions to the public directly affected by it. Additionally, why did he not build the waste station in his own front yard if its so safe. There is zero evidence to say contaminants will never leave the site once delivered.

In conclusion the above points should be considered seriously and the opinions of residents in this area should be taken onboard with the utmost respect and concern.
