Dear Sarah,

Thanks for the acknowledgement of photos, sorry to have been unclear in naming these. The 'scone horizon to mines' is a label belonging somewhere else. I think that the photo you have with that label is sent as **Photos 1**, and should have a label such as:

Aberdeen viewing position.

I'm currently trying to establish the full 10 photo sendings, I can see 9 in your reply. Then I later sent the Defence map from 1982.

** your question about my choice to be anonymous, no, I'm happy to have my identity open. If I get any backlash, well at least I can answer their questions. I wrote 'discretion' in case you saw some reason to keep the broadcasting matter a bit low.

*Perhaps we can cross-connect later about the full ten photos and labels, if you don't mind. I would be glad of that, but I have to go out very soon and won't be back until later in the afternoon.

A note on the distant photos, as you know a wide angle reduces the size and increases the distance, of centre objects. So we all try to minimise that effect, but can't answer for what computers do when they merge things. The other point is that the horizontal eye position has tremendous extra resolution, so that moons are much bigger on the horizon. That effect is important in our Scone vistas of the mines, for example, because the camera would look at it all equally, whereas the eye focuses sharply on the far mountains etc.

Hope to be able to confirm together, a list of the photo sendings, later.
