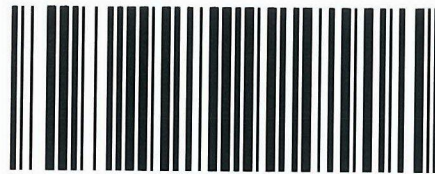

RE: Ardmore Park Quarry, Bungonia NSW

I strongly oppose to Multiquip Quarries in using our local roads to make local deliveries within the area. It saddens me to hear this new proposal on agenda, especially how Multiquip have no intentions to upgrade our roads. As a resident of Jerrara Road, I still do not want Multiquip using our road, let alone they have no intention to fix it. The new proposal seeks permission for local deliveries to commence immediately prior to the completion of the upgrade of the Project Transport Route. This is outrageous! This clearly shows Multiquip Quarries cannot be trusted, they have only one thing in mind and that is money, ignoring very serious issues that arise.

As Minister of Planning, it is imperative you understand that the latest proposal must not go ahead. Jerrara Road and the other local rural roads that he intends to use are not equipped for heavy quarry trucks, they are clearly unsafe and more innocent lives will be lost if this proposal goes ahead. The addition of 1,300 minimum requested so far extra heavy truck movements relating to quarry deliveries will create extreme conditions on our local roads and then what happens?
