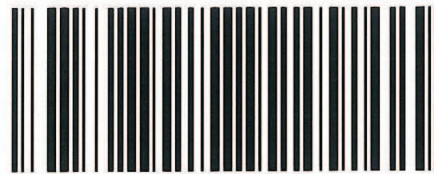

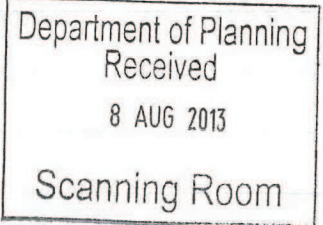

Dear Minister,

Re: Ardmore Park Quarry, Bungonia NSW

Once again my husband and I wish to strongly OBJECT to Multiquip Quarries in using our local roads to make local deliveries within the area. We object to any truck using our roads, let alone additional trucks. Our country roads are not built to share with heavy trucks on a regular basis.

Firstly, we don't trust Multiquip will upgrade Jerrara Road to the standards the original proposal was granted. Four years have passed and no work has commenced. Multiquip claims Jerrara Road will only be used after its Stage 1 works have been completed yet the new proposal seeks permission to make local deliveries immediately prior to the completion of the upgrade of the Project Transport Route. So in reality Multiquip wants to use Jerrara Road the way it is, they have no intention to upgrade, and seeking your approval.

As the minister, you cannot allow this to happen. Jerrara Road and all the local roads in our region are not safe to share with quarry trucks. More accidents will occur, lives will be lost particularly on Jerrara Road. Last year a young

boy lost his life on our roads, why would we want to add to that list? If accidents occur, blockages will occur, how long will a 48 tonne truck take to remove if it were to tip over especially around the tight corners. How will traffic get through, there is no other access? How will we get help if urgently required, if the roads are blocked? You don't need a large number of truck movements to have an accident, just one is enough. Every extra truck we allow on our roads, we only increase the danger involved, not mention increase noise pollution, air pollution, basically the quality of our lives. We moved to Burgoma for health reasons, particularly for my husband, for a better lifestyle, so far it has been great and we don't want anything to change.

Please carefully consider our objection, don't be hasty as innocent lives are at stake. Please don't approve this new proposal.
