This is an addition to the submission of the Bungonia Progress Association.

This submission supports our earlier objection to the modification specifically in respect of road safety.

Attached is a report on road traffic accidents in the Bungonia/Windellama area dated 6/8/2013 by M. Montgomery of the Goulburn Local Area Command. The report has been prepared by NSW Police. It is an official report sent to me by Superintendent Gary Worboys, the area commander for the Goulburn LAC.

These accidents occurred largely on roads proposed by Multiquip for use if the modification is approved.

The report shows 20 accidents requiring Police to attend in the 18 month period to July 2013. Tragically three of these accidents involved a fatality.

Please refer to the report.

None of these accidents involved speed or alcohol. Of the 20 accidents, 19 occurred in daylight hours. Only one accident occurred in rainy conditions whilst 2 occurred on wet roads.

Clearly the standard of the roads contributed in many cases to these accidents.

Multiquip has presented numerous reports by traffic experts over the years. These reports have been in terms of road widths, pavement condition, road standards, traffic counts etc. This report now presents objective factual evidence from Police data on recent accidents. This is a much more powerful argument as to the unsuitability of these roads for use as a heavy vehicle haul road than the concepts discussed in the reports of the traffic experts.

I would suggest the quantum of accidents is statistically significant and suggest Planning have this data analysed. In any event it seems out of proportion to road length and usage. It suggests a problem with the roads which will be worsened if they become a quarry haul route.

It should also be remembered that Police only attend a very small percentage of accidents. Under the current law it is not required to call Police unless there is an injury.

A total of 20 accidents have occurred on rural roads within the Bungonia and Windellama areas from the 1st January 2011 to 30 July 2013. Of the 20 incidents 3 have resulted in being fatal accidents. The 20 accidents have <u>not</u> been attributed to speed or alcohol as a causing factor but by other means.

Four incidents have occurred on unsealed roads. One accident has occurred in wet weather (raining) while two other had wet road surface. Nine incidents have occurred on a curved section of the road way.

Nineteen incidents have occurred in daylight hours. The main time of day occurred between 12pm and 3pm with a total of 10 incidents.

The main day of the week is Sunday with 6, followed by Thursday with five incidents. A total of 12 incidents have occurred on weekdays and eight on weekend days. See following graphs for days and time of day.
