As a resident of the affected area I object to the proposal

I am still amazed that the "cash strapped" State Government is still pursuing this folly. The reasons I object to the proposal are as follows.

- Waste of public money when there are already suitable hospitals already in the region of Manly, Mona Vale, Royal North Shore – the money should be spent wisely with the upgrading of the existing facilities to service more effectively the local communities.
- Should this hospital be sold off to the private sector then it becomes a lost to the public as a public asset.
- The reduction of amenity with destruction of a large area of natural bushland which will be devastating to both flora and fauna and replaced with a 10 story tower monstrosity on the highest natural landform in the area which will dominate the skyline
- The intersection of Wakehurst Parkway and Warringah Road and surrounds is one of the most heavily trafficked in the region and to further develop this location and increase the traffic volumes which will reduce the level of service for the intersections (which is nonexistent) is ridiculous.
- Already In the mornings and afternoons the area is area gridlocked with vehicles and emergency vehicles, if they can get through, will be significantly delayed.
