Thank you for providing Sydney Ports with the opportunity to comment on the Preferred Project Report (PPR) dated 16 January 2012 for MP10_0025 (MOD 1). Sydney Ports has reviewed the information and requests that the Department further consider the matter Sydney Ports raised regarding pedestrian management when completing the assessment process for this project.

Sydney Ports notes Lend Lease's commitment to provide a temporary pedestrian crossing across Hickson Road in close proximity to the CPT facility to allow for pedestrians to cross safely to the eastern side of Hickson Road. However, should the proposed development intend to redirect all pedestrian movements from the western side of Hickson Road (between the intersection of Shelley Street and to the north of the intersection of Napoleon Street and Hickson Road) consideration of appropriate pedestrian management at the intersection of Hickson Road and Napoleon Street should be provided while construction works are being undertaken (or until the traffic signals are installed – refer to statement of commitment no. 41).
