The Department of Planning said that it was worthy of protection. I would like to see that the land around Cullen Bullen be set aside so that it can be used by different interest groups and not just one mining company.

There are pagoda structures in both areas which may be destroyed by nearby blasting. There is no guarantee that these 250 million year old structures won't be harmed.
