Hi Ben

Thank you for your letter. My husband and I live one street down from the construction site. We are opposed to the proposed hospital for a number of reasons:

1. Brett Gooley has total disregard for all regulations of council and the Dept of Planning and behaves in a manner that is contemptuous of the residents and their concerns and he just does whatever he feels like doing. this means that, if he is approved to go ahead, anything goes and some nasty scenarios could eventuate. Definitely, to date, there has been far too little communication with the residents regarding the project and the developments that occur with regard to approvals, changes, etc.
2. The hospital project is supposed to be taking 15 years to complete. I do not fancy 15 years of this noise and dust and eyesore that we have been subjected to and nor does my husband. Nor is it acceptable to every neighbour I have spoken to, especially the people in Goolagong St and even more especially those right next to it.
3. Recently, my husband and I rescued a fledgeling Nankeen ( Australian) Kestrel that was injured on its wing and was going back and forth under the worksite fence and then coming back onto the council strip. The dear sweet little baby died at the vet's. I have photos I took of it while I was getting it to trust me, so that I could pick it up. I can send you these photos if you like. We were devastated. Its mummy hunted for it for days. She often lands on aviaries in Goolagong St. She is often seen over the hospital worksite and it is the type of terrain that kestrels like to nest in. They also hunt field mice and insects and the hospital site used to be fields

There is a small flock of crimson rosellas that spend a lot of time over and in the worksite
