I write to strongly object to the quality of the Environmental Assessment undertaken for the Orange Pipeline Project.

The current EA is a sampling "snap shot" rather than a seasonally holistic study.

The proposed off take sight(s) for this project is located on a very sensitive riverine ecosystem. Native and endangered fish use it much like a migratory highway at different times of the year- therefore sampling over a short time is grossly inadequate.

Furthermore, I wold like to ad- <u>YOU CAN NOT MANAGE WHAT YOU CAN NOT COUNT</u>. More accurate studies need to be completed so that endangered and native fish stocks can be monitored in future.

I would suggest:

•Quantify the presence of Native and Endangered Fish in the impacted section of the Macquarie River under base, and low flow conditions; through detailed seasonal sampling.

•Develop potential impact pathways (e.g. loss of river connectivity, off-take structures, changes in stream flow, pool dynamics etc);

•Assess the potential impacts and ecological implications for Native and Endangered Fish from the project;

• Determine how potential impacts can be mitigated or avoided; and

• Develop an ongoing Native Fish monitoring program pre and post project development.
