The whole amenity of our home will be ruined if this wind farm is built. We will have dozens of turbines starting at just over 2km to the south east, going up rising country. I think we are home j 157 and EPYC have only rated or home at moderate-high for visual impact. The impact will be more than moderate for us! We chose this area for its scenic value - this will be ruined.

I have poor hearing and this is already made worse by traffic noise, low rumbling and background noise. I have visited wind farms and I believe my hearing will suffer if Jupiter is built. I am also very concerned about noise at night and its effect on our sleep and health. There is research being done by the NHMRC now. At least wait until this is finished before saying yes to any more wind farms.

There are already too many homes in the area for a development like Jupiter to be built and more subdivisions will happen if Jupiter is stopped. If Jupiter is approved I don't think many more people would move to the area. We have another building entitlement on our land but here is no way we will invest any more money in our property if Jupiter Wind Farm is approved. I doubt we could get a loan.

The region already has more than enough wind farms any more will make it undesirable to move here. Even those people who say they like wind farms don't want to live near one!

The wireframe referring to our property shows over 40 turbines. The size is more likely understated, it is horrific. If anyone believes these towers can be screened they would have to be brain dead.

We live in a rural environment and don't just sit in our homes looking out a window or sitting on the deck. I work in the paddocks most of the day.

I have been on the CCC and was there when EPYC gave out a quite threatening letter to all the community representatives. It demanded to know what groups community reps were in. It was very inappropriate, and aggressive.

EPYCs communication has been terrible and I don't think they care about people or the area at all. They have upset all the locals and they never provide information until its dragged out of them. The information days were rubbish; like a child's school project on wind farms.

The presentation given at a CCC Meting by ERM was pathetic and I had a feeling they had used the same words when doing an EIS for other wind farms. I noticed when they were stuck for an answer one of the other speakers quickly introduced another subject.

In 2014 two public meetings were attended by approx 200 people at each meeting. These meetings were attended by Angus Taylor and Pru Goward who both spoke against Jupiter wind farm. Over 95% of people attending were against the wind farm.

More recently a meeting was organised by Department of Planning. The Department asked Tarago CWA to cater for 25 people - approx 180 attended, including 5 hosts, and of those again 95%+ were against Jupiter wind farm. ABC filmed the meeting and it was reported in local press.

The stress from this project has been intense and a lot of people are really struggling. The project needs to be rejected quickly so people can get over it and then go on with their lives.

I spend every summer maintaining the property so it is fire ready, I don't want more bushes or trees near the house, they will be more fuel for ember attack. I worry about the trees we have now, it is a real possibility that these will be burnt down. We have already lost trees to fire. I have even been considering removing some .

The wind farm will also be a danger for the pilots of the water bombers in the fire season. They are invaluable out here and they already fly over the fire through smoke to save homes. I don't think they should be asked to dodge turbines as well.

We really don't want to live here if Jupiter is built but I don't think it will be easy to sell up and move once it is approved. Who will pay me a good price for a house under wind turbines when they can go elsewhere? This property was paid for by our life savings. Selling our property at some stage was part of our retirement plan.

As it is claimed there is no property devaluation, we need a guarantee to be put in writing that the Government of the day will compensate us if devaluation occurs. If this is not done it is very un-Australian and shows a lack of duty of care to constituents, tax payers and rate payers.

If Jupiter is approved then EPYC should have to buy us out so we can move away from their wind farm. It's the least they can do for the damage they would inflict on us.
