Dear Sir,

I wish to make strong objection to Wilpinjung Coal S75W modification.

I live within the village of Wallas and already find that the scientific modeling for noise, dust etc have been incorrect.

We are being subjected to toxic fumes from spontaneous combustion causing health issues and many reports to the E.P.A. An independent study for Wilpinjung Coal found that on separate occasions we have been subjected to fumes above the recommended Health level causing headaches, dizziness and sore eyes.

An Australian Medical Association submission to a Senate Inquiry found Australian air quality standards lagged behind international standards and had failed to keep pace with scientific evidence.

The Environment Assessment by Wilpinjung Coal States that "Mod 5" would not significantly alter the potential for Spontaneous Combustion. From what we have already experienced this "MOD 5" is not acceptable.

The area of "MOD 5" would involve clearing of native vegetation 30 ha of woodland, 22 ha of grassland, this comes to 55 hectares not 70 hectares they require.

Has there been a study to locate, investigate a Koala colony within this area? a Koala was observed and photographed this year, article in Mudgee Guardian paper this year.

A large publicity shoot for relocating wombats was previously undertaken, is this program to continue?

The tree corridor, published in the Mudgee Guardian to provide habitat for listed endangered bird life is that being monitored?

The modification would not alter the workforce as stated in the Proposal so no further jobs would be provided under this modification.
