2) Shooters, trespasses on our land. When approached they say " we work for Wilpinjong we are allowed to shoot" This is especially frightening especially at night when my husband is away.

3) Decline in services in the area. Peabody stated all services except alcohol will remain. Yet they

changed their mind leaving us without mechanical services, rural hardware just to mention a few. Mail is now delivered only 3 times a week.

Mudgee Vet does not do his round on Thursdays due to lack of demand.

4) Peabody cannot handle the dust and spontaneous combustion issues they have now. What will happen when they increase production?

5) Noise. We are affected when cloud inversions cover our valley. In the narrow valley blast noise can be deafening causing cattle to be frightened and break our cattle yards.

6) Quality of noise monitering. The monitor on our neighbors place stated dogs barking. Yet she does not have a dog.

If the modification does proceed I ask you make it a condition the permanent residents in the Barigan Valley are given the opportunity to sell our farm to Peabody. Even their own valuer stated " one of the reasons the farm did not sell at auction is its proximity to the mine."
