I am writing to strongly oppose the development of the Moorebank intermodal, the reasons been increased traffic gridlock, increase noise and dirt and increase health risks to all residents in the area especially the next generation.

There are many roads in the area that will be effected, Nurwarra Rd is a major access rd to and from the M5, it is a single lane road and even in the middle of the day becomes congested with trucks, during peak times, Nurwarra Rd becomes a car park, this also has a flow on effect onto Brickmakers Dr and Newbridge Rd.
