In particular I OBJECT to the following aspects:

• SIZE, BULK AND SCALE OF THE MAIN HOSPITAL TOWER BUILDING for the following reasons:

I consider this development of approximately 27,000sqm is inappropriate for the site because of its bulk and height as it adjoins 1-2 storey homes and therefore create a precedent for any future development in the area.

The impact on the heritage listed area and the loss of many trees on the site

- SERVICED SENIORS LIVING Apartment Blocks for the following reasons:
- Concern about the proposal of residential serviced flats on a hospital site which should be subject to the same rules as anyother residential development not given special treatment because it is tacked onto a hospital development. These units will have a signicant impact on the surrounding residential area because of their height and bulk.

- IMPACT ON BUSHLAND AND ENVIRONMENT for the following reasons:
- The removal of so many trees on this site is of real concern because of the loss of tree canopy because of the overdevelopment of this DA

- TRAFFIC AND SAFETY CONCERNS for the following reasons:
- The increased traffic flow onto residential streets and to Greenwich road as a result of the proposed residential serviced appartments will have detrimental effect on traffic flow in the surrounding area. A traffic management plan is required to address these concerns.
