

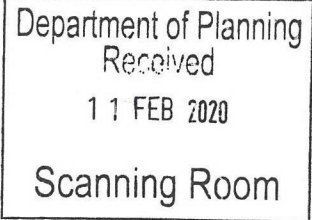
PROPOSED MOUNT PIPER ENERGY RECOVERY PROJECT

Dear Ms.Munk,

I object to the proposed Mount Piper Energy Recovery Project (Recyclable materials burning) at the Mount Piper Power Plant, State Significant Development (SSD8294).

It would be a major emitter of greenhouse gases. Toxic ash and gases produced by the proposed incinerator would poison both the air and the waterways of the Blue Mountains and Sydney Water.

This proposed incinerator would produce far more CO2 per unit of energy generated than coal or oil or gas fired power stations.

The incinerator could destroy plastics and paper which should be reused.

Ash from burning waste is toxic and must be disposed of as intractable waste in a lined cell. Proximity to the Cox's River means that the site is a threat to the supply of Drinking Water for Warragamba Dam and Sydney.

A large fleet of rubbish trucks would cause great disruption and negatively impact the Blue Mountains community: Usually in the early morning the Great Western Highway and the Bells Line of Road would expect a convoy of smelly trucks.

This proposal must be rejected.
