The Foundation was established in 2008 after my Father Biaggio passed away from Mesothelioma,

The Star has been a continued supporter of the Foundation

My Father arrived on the shores of Pyrmont wharves in 1954, after arriving he worked in the Pyrmont area unloading fruit & vegetables at Darling Harbour goods yard, he later worked as a coil winder company whereby he was exposed to Asbestos, he later died in 2008

To celebrate Immigration in Australia a life size bronze statue named “**life from a suitcase**” was unveiled in March 2010 by the then Governor of NSW Marie Bashir AD, CVO is located on Darling Island wharf 12 opposite THE STAR

This statue is a life size portrait of a the Signorelli Family migrants arriving from Italy post war, the statue is visited by many local and international visitors of the Star and with the new developments proposed the artwork will have greater visitation and promote that Pyrmont was the landing suburb to many migrants

The Star proposed \$500million investment in Pyrmont and the upgrades of the Pirrama Road will increase the visitation as a whole
