Hi Louise,

We have reviewed the EIS and note that Ausgrid's requirements have not been addressed.

The proponent has also failed to address the SER's by providing any detail regarding how the development will be supplied from the Ausgrid Network and how the existing Ausgrid assets within the site will be treated. Ausgrid's view is that there are some significant cable relocations required for the development with respect to the 66kV overhead poles and wires on the site.

Our original requirements outlined in the email below have also not been addressed in the EIS.

The lack of consideration given to these issues is concerning and Ausgrid recommends these be addressed prior to project approval given the potential impact to the development layout.

Hi Louise,

The proposed development is adjacent a major Ausgrid substation.

The use of the land as a hospital should be carefully considered.

In this regard, Ausgrid require that due consideration be given to the compatibility of the proposed development with the existing Ausgrid infrastructure, particularly in relation to risks of electrocution, fire risks, electric and magnetic fields (EMF), noise, visual amenity and other matters that may impact on Ausgrid or the development.

It should be noted that trying to mitigate such impacts for established developments can be very expensive and is often limited by design factors. For this reason, the most cost-effective option is usually modification of the proposed development early in the assessment process. Such measures could include appropriate buffer distances, screening structures, building design, orientation and construction.

Prior to any development being carried out, the approved plans must be submitted to Ausgrid for approval to determine whether the development will affect Ausgrid's network or easements. The developer must identify any potential impacts of the proposed construction and operation on the existing utility infrastructure and service provider assets, and demonstrate how these will be protected or impacts mitigated.

The applicant must check the location of underground cables by using *Dial Before You Dig* and comply with the requirements of *NS156: Working Near or Around Underground Cables* (Ausgrid, 2010).

Prior to the issue of a Construction Certificate (or an Occupation Certificate where a Construction Certificate is not required), the applicant must provide to the consent authority and Ausgrid a noise assessment report. The report must address, in relation to the adjacent substation, the requirements of the amenity or intrusive criteria in section 2.4 of the *NSW Industrial Noise Policy* (EPA, 2000).

The development must comply with both the Reference Levels and the precautionary requirements of the ICNIRP Guidelines for Limiting Exposure to Time-varying Electric and Magnetic Fields (1 HZ – 100 kHZ) (ICNIRP 2010).

The development must comply with *Tree Safety Management Plan* (Ausgrid, 2007).

The development must be carried out in accordance with *ENA EG1-2006: Substation Earthing Guide* (Energy Networks Association, 2006).

Additionally, the developer should prepare an infrastructure plan detailing information on the existing capacity and any augmentation and easement requirements of the development for the provision of utilities including staging of infrastructure.
