Description of the development consent

To establish an underground mine and associated infrastructure to extract 750,000 tonnes of ore per year until 31 December 2026, and transport ore concentrate by rail to Port Pirie in South Australia and Newcastle in New South Wales.

Description of proposed modification

The modification involves:

- The use of the Kintore Pit as a new tailing storage facility (TSF3) for naturally dried tailings;
- Co-disposal of excess waste rock from underground with tailing in Kintore Pit (TSF3);
- Relocating the current mine portal and access decline with associated infrastructure to a new boxcut;
- Harvesting naturally dried tailings from the Blackwood Pit (TSF2) and transfer into TSF3;
- Conducting periodic crushing of non-ore material in the Kintore Pit and/or BHP Pit;
- Use of waste rock for rehabilitation capping; and
- Changes to administrative requirements for annual reporting and noise criteria.

About the exhibition

An exhibition process allows any individual or organisation to have their say about a proposed development.

The Department of Planning, Industry and Environment is exhibiting an application to modify the abovementioned approved State Significant Development (SSD). The application and accompanying documents are on exhibition from **Wednesday 8 September 2021** until **Tuesday 21 September 2021**.
