I Object To The Powerhouse Parramatta Project.

I was born and raised in Parramatta, and my parents and grandparents all lived nearby. Parramatta was at the centre of their world. All of the important life events took place in the local churches, especially at St John's, one of the most significant buildings of the area. Their social activities, education, shopping, doctors, and hospitals were all centred on this town/city.

Parramatta is, or was, a special place, being the second settlement to be established in New South Wales – a place where the soil was good enough to feed the young colony. A place where important early buildings were erected and still, generally, exist. A place where education, such as The Kings School, began vey early. A place where the Governors chose to live for much of their time here.
