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This is our submission in support of keeping the Museum of Applied Arts and Sciences (aka more affectionately as 'Our Powerhouse') at its present site in Ultimo.

We believe that such historic homes as the very early, maternity hospital, Willow Grove, and St George's Terrace, both of which were built in the mid 1800's, should not be sacrificed for such an ugly, white elephant-milk crate-type design of a building. These are beautiful buildings of heritage value and are to be demolished so this monstrosity can be constructed on the side of Parramatta River which is flood prone!

This is madness. It is vandalism, and it is a crime... disguised as a 'gift' to the people in

in Western Sydney) from the Premier... and the only people thanking her for it will be the developers. No one here wants it!

We object passionately to the New South Wales Government destroying our Powerhouse and the new location is not at all viable for any decent museum. I have lived in Greystanes for nearly 35 years and Parramatta is where I shopped. David Jones, on the 'Riverbank' used to flood often, because it was built too close to the river. Eventually, it moved and the fruit shop and other assorted retailers that moved in next (in the same building!) frequently had problems with water flowing down the inside steps. Then, as recently as last year when diving down Church St, the weir (even though we were in drought) was flooding once again and I said to my husband, "and they want to build a museum here ???!" (Pondle Hill Creek, Finlayson's Creek, Cooper's Creek & Joongabbie Creek rise and flood over the weir). Parramatta Museum and Heritage Centre plus the Riverside Theatre do not have this problem. Even though quite close to the river, they are located on the northern (higher!) side of the river!

Three years ago, when we heard that this was a possibility, I went up and down Willow Street asking people what they thought about the idea of demolishing the Powerhouse in Sydney and moving it to Parramatta. My responses were:- "What's the Powerhouse?" and "Don't go to Museums!" and 'Definitely, will not be going to the Powerhouse, if it

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moves to Parramatta, because there is only one Powerhouse... and they, better not move it !!'

At our street Christmas party last year, the mood had changed significantly. There was still a few who were not 'interested in museums', however, by then many of the young children had been taken to the Powerhouse with the school and others had been taken to the Powerhouse by their parents. Most of these people in Willow St., now understood that destroying museums was just so wrong.

So, we are really, really, upset about the dismantling of the Powerhouse in Ultimo and the very, very real possibility of selling, lending or sending pieces of such historical significance, hither and thither; some to Parramatta, to storage at leastle Hill, around New South Wales or possibly, around Australia, into private collections.

I can't believe that a Government, of any party, could be so reckless and so opportunistic that they would even consider breaking up or selling off priceless pieces donated over many years to this museum. Not only is this wrong, but if it is the case and they get scattered, it is a criminal and illegal act, as these artefacts and historic pieces are the property of the people of Sydney, N.S.W. and Australia. Many people have now been asking for their donated items to be returned to them, as they fear that they

will not be looked after and given the same excellent care that the Sowerhouse has been able to provide up until now.

The Sowerhouse tells the story of our country, good and bad, with all its faults, flaws, blunders and imperfections. It teaches our children social skills and how to overcome bullying, ignorance and racism and how to get along with each other. It shows how people discovered other ways of doing things... how necessity became the mother of invention! Children and adults, too, learn from the panels on exhibitions that are a feature of the museum.

How to change from 'braving heat to making hand-dominants' (and 'making marks') for the people of 'today', in another innovation which people have easily been able to adapt to, when we've discovered the folly of having most things 'made in China'!

Every man, woman and child comes away from the Sowerhouse with a feeling of wonderment! There is just no other place like it in Aotearoa and (not why) the government wants to destroy such a thing because it continues to astound us all!

The Sowerhouse shows us what educationalists have achieved in the past and what we might be capable of achieving in the future, through technology and manufacturing! We all meet the Sowerhouse.

We've taken all our nieces and nephews to the Powerhouse in Sydney, at different times, just like we've taken them to the Australian Museum, the Mitchell Library, the Art Gallery, The Observatory and the Justice Museum but they've always wanted to go back to the Powerhouse! We just wouldn't have been able to manage it, if we'd needed to go to Campbelltown or Gosford... Ultimo is easy to get to - it would be such a shame if it disappeared!

I'm writing this submission the day after the unions placed a green ban on our historic homes at Parramatta. At long last... someone has decided to do the right thing, and try to save them from being demolished! Even though Jack Munday, out of desperation joined the Greens to advocate for the climate, he would have been so proud of them and so pleased that the unions were trying to protect these historic homes. He was at our protest outside Willow Grove in 2018, not long before he died.

Once gone - gone forever!


