Summary


No expansion to Moriah College is required. No evidence that student numbers will increase.

In planning submissions to date no detailed evidence has been provided if Moriah College requires the additional capacity. Staff and student numbers at Moriah College for the last seven do not indicate any real growth. A detailed investigation of local demographics and sources of potential students is required. Historical records indicate no growth in student numbers.


Historical records, from the Moriah College annual reports, for the last seven years indicate that there has been no real growth in staff and pupil numbers at Moriah College. During the last seven years the total number people either working at and/or attending the college has been static, non-K-12 students are decreasing, K-12 student attendance is variable with a slight trend indicating that are decreasing. If the non-K-12 are prekindergarten students, there may be a strong possibility that K-12 numbers could decline.


