We wish to strongly object to Kores
"Wallarah 2" again applying to open a mine
in Dorralong Valley and surrounds.

We have owned our property at
140 Durren Rd. Jillyby since 1969 and have
been worried since June 2001 when the subject
of coal "Kores" later name changed to "Wallarah 2"
have been trying to start a mine here on
the Central Coast.

Our water supply on the Central Coast
which covers from Hawksbury River up to Wyee
including millions of permanent homes as well as
thousands of holiday visitors. Every summer
we have water restrictions and if a mine
is approved we will lose our water supply.

All water from any creeks in Dorralong and
Dorralong Valley go into our dams at Mardi and Mangrove
dams and we all know how much water mines use.

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I might add our dams are never ever be full especially Mangrove Mountain Dam. after heavy rains we regularly have our roads flooded and can be cut off by floods unable to get into town some times for 4 days at a time. The subsidence will make the floods a lot worse, plus what damage the subsidence will do to all our property, homes, dams and roads.

Dust from the coal trains will be causing great harm to our lungs causing unbelieveable damage to our health.

Premier Barry O'Farrell came to Wyong in January 2009 made this promise

"No Gfs No Buts" no mining in water catchment area

Bruce Baird also came to Wyong made same promise, don't promises count any more.
