We neighbour Gloucester Shire and drink the water from the catchment area there. Additionally, we are a part of the community, participating in farmers markets at Gloucester since the markets began operation years ago.

It is a stunningly beautiful town, ringed by vast amounts of natural beauty. It is unimaginable that short term mining operations would be put ahead of people, the amenity of the town, tourism, farming, health and long term impacts that might not even be foreseen now but will be detrimental to Gloucester for generations.
