I wish to register my objection to the Gunlake Quarry extension D/A in its present form.

To my knowledge Gunlake Quarry have not held any public meetings with regard to their extension application to quarry 2 million tonnes of gravel at their Marulan site nor have they consulted with the residents of Red Hills Rd as required in the SEAR's document.

At present Gunlake is using Brayton Rd and the Bypass Rd. as their haulage route to the Hume Highway. Gunlake constructed the Bypass Rd which in my opinion is inadequate and dangerous for their present load and they propose to use it in the long term as their haulage route. This, I believe, is untenable.

This new D/A for 2 million tonnes should be considered a new project and as such Gunlake should be required to construct a suitable haulage route to accommodate large volumes and not impact on the safety, health, wellbeing and quality of life of local residents not to mention land values which will suffer as a result if they do not.

Gunlake seems hell bent on constructing and operating their quarry on a shoestring for the greatest profit at the expense of the local area.

Marulan is in the Sydney/Canberra corridor and is becoming increasingly important as a residential area. We are not opposed to quarrying, but any development must be sensitive to all land users not just quarries.
