Opening that it says the response is not by the Zoo people themselves but by JBA on their behalf .. and that "JBA operates under a Quality Management System that has been certified as complying with ISO 9001:2008. This report has been prepared and reviewed in accordance with that system" and I would like to comment that I generally this that is VERY GOOD that they so operate (but would also be interested in finding out exactly by who was their QMS certified. Does Planning know that, please?

Apart from that my comments are very few and minor.

As the Zoo will have a capital investment value of \$28 million it certainly well comes under current SSD procedure.

I think the Government (via WSPT) did make it very well know that it wanted tourism or educational used of that part of Bungarribee (maybe even eco-tourism was mentioned?) and I remember roadside advertising being up there about that. A zoo well fits the original desire I think.

I'd imagine the general population too is much more desirous of 'a zoo' than just 'more open space' (even though there is concern about loss of open space in the broader picture).

But even though I'd have imagined the general public would welcome a zoo, it is interesting that ONLY ONE of the submissions from individuals, landowners and non-government groups [sometimes collectively referred to as 'the community'] actually supported the proposal according to the reply to submissions.

The list of concerns from submissions is headed with "Heritage (Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal)".

Here is my main comment on that: The "OEH outlined that due to other pressing issues no comments on Aboriginal heritage were able to be provided. It is noted that the OEH were unable to review the submitted Aboriginal heritage information" - My comment is that this is ENTIRELY UNSATISFACTORY and should not

be accepted, and that OEH should be INSTRUCTED by higher in Government to do otherwise.

Also can you please find out for me what were some of these "other pressing issues" OEH was labouring under?

Were any of its pressing issue perhaps related to downsizing or de-staffing matters?

Re proposed collaboration with Muru Mittigar - please see petition that has been raised by Muru Mittigar that the survival of it and its nursery at Upper Castlereagh is now feared to be under threat due to possible commercialisation pressures on the land for other uses (housing or commercial) and that it seemingly does not feel its future there has been assured in any way by Government (I can give you more information on this if you did not know about it).

The RTS really doesn't seem to address physical in any way at all .. does it?

My bottom line concern is what is left ...for this part or for/from ANY of Bungarribee. What moveable heritage is there -- and were is it currently? Is there any plan to incorporate ANY of it any display or educational sidelines to the new zoo? For example (comparison), the Community Centre at Bungarribee it has once been said would display Aboriginal heritage including silcrete .. but when I went there to check this it seems to have never happened(?). Also there has been good fossil wood found on Bugarribee and it would be good to see this kept track of (wherever it might end up).

One of the conflict factors has been the feared adverse effects on the long-established local Featherdale zoo, and it is nice to see that the bigger new zoo might perhaps take Featherdale to its bossom with some cooperative ventures that can ensure the survival of Featherdale ("Sydney Zoo believes that there is a great opportunity for the Zoo and Featherdale to work together constructively...").

Re Australian animal content of the new zoo, I think I have written before can the new zoo play a part in returning vanished animals to the Cumberland Plain.

I have especially suggested the return be facilitated of the Doonside Death Bird (curlew).

Also is the dingo native to this area and should be returned ...?... at least one local has told me he thinks the dingo was native, until relatively recent times.

Re that wastewater from the hippopotamus pool (now proposed to hold Asian Water Buffalo - does this mean the hippos are 'out' of consideration or are the water buffalo an added attraction), the aquaria and wet moats, it was thought such may require additional or alternative treatment. Has that been concluded.

I am a policies student (Master of Policy Studies UNSW) and one of the policy area I have been trying to come to grips with is OFFSETS

So I am interested in the bit about "In particular, there is some uncertainty as to the minimum thresholds at which the NSW Biodiversity Offsets Policy for Major Projects and the Framework for Biodiversity Assessment should be applied". Can I please find out more about that .. and has this uncertainty yet been settled.
