Regards the direction
of the Pacific Highway - ie either
diverting from the existing
highway from 4 mile Lane (just
south of Stn Grafton) or at
the Glenugie turn. I think
that the Glenugie turn is by
far the most practical solution.

This route covers less valuable
land and therefore would put
less people out of business and
would destroy far less homes.

Also as a person who has had
a lot of experience with wild life
in that area (between Glenugie and
Turahia) I think with the type
of fence there will be on the
eastern side of the road the

wild life will be protected to a greater degree than before.

This last year I saw 3 emus near the present highway at Ulmarra. They are coming further away from their natural country looking for greener pastures. They will be protected to a greater degree by the Glenelg division.
