I will advise Thursday morning of the outcome.

Council's position focuses on road impacts, community enhancement and community consultation.

As the routes for heavy vehicles (and related consent conditions) are not changing there are not problems in this regard.

Under Council's Community Enhancement Fund Policy as the size of the turbines increases so too does the contribution per turbine. Based on the size of turbines proposed the current day value is \$3,842/turbine.

In relation to community consultation our comments remain the same as previous ones – all issues raised by local residents to be addressed in the assessment, local forum with submitters to clarify concerns and seek response from proponent, assessment report being publically available prior to any determination, any PAC hearing to be held locally with the opportunity for submitters to address the PAC.
