Thank you for the opportunity to provide advice on the above matter.

GSNSW previously provided advice on the *Exhibition of the EIS for SSD 6324 – Bringelly Business Hub* on 20/2/2015 (reference OUT15/4031) where GSNSW advised we had no resource issues to raise regarding the proposal.

Our position remains unchanged, however we would further advise that Coal Authorisation (AUTH) 424, held by the Secretary of the Department of Industry on behalf of the Crown, exists over a broad regional area that includes the subject site. Identification of the title is to make the consent authority aware that there are other stakeholders with interests in the region.
