This is an objection to the Santos Narrabri Gas both the project itself and the EIS.

Coal Seam Gas – An ongoing environmental and political issue that we have all heard about and have strong opinions towards.

Gas companies such as Santos are harming families everyday and there have been multiple cases proving the toxicity in the chemicals they use to mine have made small children and many families very sick with symptoms such as bleeding noses, gonising migraines and cancer.

A man named George Bender recently committed suicide due to the pressure he was put under by Origin Energy, a huge Gas Company, he was harassed to sign his land over so it could be mined and demolished by them, this is a devastating and extreme example but the repercussions Gas companies such as Santos have on families and the communities is too real to just ignore, we all need to fight this injustice together and show we won't be exported just as our resources are.

My limited objection here supports and upholds the submissions of the Coonabarabran Residents Against Gas, the People for the Plains and the North West Alliance submissions opposing this risky and unsustainable project.
