Exhibition of the Narrabri Gas Project – Multi-Agency Review

Dear Mr O'Donoghue

Thank you for your letter seeking Transport for NSW (TfNSW) feedback with regards to the exhibition of Narrabri Gas Project Environmental Impact Study (EIS). Please accept this letter as a joint TfNSW and RMS response. A number of points have been raised that should be noted and addressed, as outlined below.

TfNSW and RMS primary interests are in the road network, traffic and broader transport issues. In particular, the efficiency and safety of the classified road network, the security of property assets and the integration of land use and transport. With respect to the Traffic Impact Assessment report provided a number of points are noted:

- There is no access for triple road trains in this region. There is access on the Newell in this region for modular B-triples but not for 36.5m B-triples or AB triples.
- The Secretary's Environmental Assessment Requirements (SEARs) requires a clear indication of construction traffic in terms of vehicle type, the general use of 'standard truck sizes' will require further clarity.
- The haulage route from the Port of Newcastle needs to be identified, as the Newell Highway does not provide direct access to Newcastle.
- Clarification is sought as to why both diesel fuel and miscellaneous minor deliveries are being included as part of oversize movements (refer to Tables 5-3 & 5-4 Haulage Movements). The proponent should confirm that all items listed in Tables 5-3 & 5-4 are oversized movements.
- The operational traffic movements in section 6 need to be broken down into vehicle types.
