  withheld by making a clear statement to this effect, however, all submissions are uploaded automatically to our website.
- 2. Your submission must include:
  - · your name, your postal address and your email address
  - the name of the application (Epping to Thorleigh Third Track) and the application number (SSI 5132)
  - · a statement on whether you support or object the proposal
  - · the reasons why you support or object the proposal

concerned with noise issues on the Epping to Thornleigh	Third Track proposal –
SS1 5132.	
Our issue is that the CURRENT noise levels already exceed	ed the maximum noise
guidelines and we are concerned that these unacceptable	noise levels will not be
reduced or addressed in the proposal. In fact, we anticipat	e an increase in
disturbance because of the increase in the frequency of fre	eight services.

Our properties back onto the eastern side of the railway line. We are particularly susceptible to railway noise because of the topography of our location for the following reasons:
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following reasons:
Because we back onto the railway line, there is effectively no barrier
between our homes and the railway.
There are tall, large footprint buildings on the western side of the line,
directly opposite us, and these act to reflect the rail noise straight back to
us, increasing its impact.
<ul> <li>We are on a very steep gradient of the line as it leads into Pennant Hills,</li> </ul>
thus we get more low speed diesel noise and more wagon clunking
As we are close to the curve approaching Pennant Hills, we get noise from
both sides, both from the line behind us and from the stretch of line that
curves back towards Beecroft.
—— We request consideration for special treatment for this area in analysing and
treating the noise that affects our small community. In particular, we request that
you consider treatments, such as a noise barrier on the eastern side of the
railway in addition to ongoing work in reducing the noise at source.

## What happens to my submission?

The NSW Department of Planning and Infrastructure will review the submissions report and the Environmental Impact Statement prior to making a recommendation for determination to the NSW Minister for Planning and Infrastructure.
